# Achievements and performance Section D Summary of the main Coffee morning continue to be popular in spite of difficulties in booking achievements of the charity mediums. during the year A hugely successful "Dinner with Spirit" and Open Day were held. Two additional Chairpersons have been trained up for service. The Church and grounds have needed a great deal of investment (by law, work generated by risk assessments) this year to maintain it and provide for the years to come. We have managed to do this out of income generated by church activities and donations. The Kent Scholarship continues to fund the training for one healer per year. (the name is in recognition of Minister Peter Kent's incredible dedication to Spirt and Church for 50 Years.) We have continued with our support to the Churches in Reading Drop In Centre (CIRDIC) by donations and contributions of food from the congregation. This charity gives help to people in the Reading area who are struggling and in great need. A donation to the Two Worlds spiritual magazine to help with the cost of publication. Daisy's Dream, a local charity for children was a nominated charity
