THE OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY ARE FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT: THE ADVANCEMENT OF HEALTH AND IN PARTICULAR, WITHOUT LIMITATION, THE FUNDING OF TREATMENT AND CARE FOR WOMEN SUFFERING WITH OBSTETRIC FISTULA; AND THE ADVANCEMENT OF EDUCATION IN PARTICULAR, WITHOUT LIMITATION, IN THE SUBJECT OF OBSTETRIC FISTULAS.

MAY 2017 – DECEMBER 2017 WAS A TIME OF GREAT GROWTH AT OPERATION FISTULA. OVER THE COURSE OF THESE MONTHS, THE FOUNDATIONS FOR SCALE WERE DEVELOPED, IN BOTH OPERATIONS AND PROJECT WORK.

OPERATIONAL GROWTH DEVELOPED HAND-IN-HAND WITH INCREASED INVESTMENT FROM DONORS, IN SUPPORT OF AN EXPANDED PORTFOLIO OF PROJECT WORK.

WORK IS CURRENTLY FOCUSED ON A NEW PROJECT, IN PARTNERSHIP WITH UNFPA'S "CAMPAIGN TO END FISTULA", TO DELIVER OUR DIGITIZED PATIENT DATA COLLECTION TOOL TO FIVE PROJECT COUNTRIES: BANGLADESH, CAMEROON, MADAGASCAR, MALAWI, AND NEPAL.

OPERATION FISTULA WILL USE DATA COLLECTED FROM THESE PROJECTS, AND CUTTING-EDGE DATA VISUALIZATION SOFTWARE, TO MAP OBSTETRIC FISTULA, AND PROVIDE UNFPA, GOVERNMENT, AND NGO PARTNERS WITH AN UNPRECEDENT DEGREE OF INSIGHT INTO THE PREVALENCE, TREATMENT, AND PERSISTENCE OF OBSTETRIC FISTULA IN THESE COUNTRIES.

FURTHER TO THIS, OPERATION FISTULA DEVELOPED AND BEGAN TO IMPLEMENT A PROJECT WITH THE GOVERNMENT OF MADAGASCAR, TO ELIMINATE OBSTETRIC FISTULA WITHIN THAT COUNTRY. THIS PROJECT INVOLVES WORKING TO IMPROVE THE WHOLE PATIENT JOURNEY, INCLUDING: PATIENT IDENTIFICATION AND DIAGNOSIS, MOBILIZATION TO TREATMENT, SURGERY AND CLINICAL CARE, QUALITY POST-OPERATIVE CARE, AND SUPPORTING SOCIAL REINTEGRATION FOLLOWING TREATMENT.

AT THIS STAGE, OPERATION FISTULA'S TEAM HAS SUCCESSFULLY CONDUCTED SITE VISITS AND NEEDS ASSESSMENTS AT FOUR HOSPITALS IN THE SAVA REGION OF MADAGASCAR.

THE OPERATION FISTULA TEAM GREW FROM TWO FULL-TIME STAFF MEMBERS, OPERATING WITH LIMITED VOLUNTEER SUPPORT, TO A TEAM OF FIVE FULL-TIME EQUIVALENTS, OPERATING WITH THE SUPPORT OF VOLUNTEERS, AND REMOTE CONSULTANTS, ADMINISTERING THE WORK IN PROJECT COUNTRIES. ADDITIONALLY, LOCAL CONSULTANT SURGEONS AND NURSES HAVE BEEN EMPLOYED BY OPERATION FISTULA TO LEAD THESE PROGRAMS.

THIS YEAR OPERATION FISTULA SUCCESSFULLY LAUNCHED A MAJOR PROJECT IN PARTINERSHIP WITH UNFPA, ACROSS 5 COUNTRIES, WITH SUPPORT FROM DIVERSE PARTNERS.

PROJECT PLANS HAVE BEEN DEVELOPED FOR THIS WORK, WITH TRAVEL AND MEETINGS SCHEDULED FOR EARLY 2018 TO ALL PARTNER COUNTRIES.

INSIGHTS GAINED THROUGH THIS WORK WILL BE SHARED WITH UNFPA, LOCAL GOVERNMENT, AND NGO PARTNERS TO ALLOW FOR THE MORE EFFECTIVE AND FOCUSED MOBILIZATION OF RESOURCES AND CARE TO THE WOMEN AND GIRLS SUFFERING WITH OBSTETRIC FISTULA.

FURTHER TO THIS, WE SUCCESSFULLY LAUNCHED AND BEGAN IMPLEMENTATING A PROJECT IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE GOVERNMENT OF MADAGASCAR. THIS PROJECT WILL WORK ACROSS THE WHOLE CONTINUUM OF CARE, AND HAS THE CAPACITY TO TRANSFORM THE METHODOLOGIES AND APPROACHES BEING USED TO ELIMINATE OBSTETRIC FISTULA FOR EVERY WOMEN, EVERYWHERE.

## 1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with FRS 102, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (as applied to small entities by section 1A of the standard).

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are measured at cost less accumulative depreciation and any accumulative impairment losses. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:
