- Any charitable purpose for the time being of any Connexional, District, Circuit and local or other organisation of the Methodist Church
- Any charitable purpose for the time being of any society or institution subsidiary or ancillary to The Methodist Church
- Any purpose for the time being of any charity being a charity subsidiary or ancillary to The Methodist Church

Achievements and Performance

Summary of Main Achievements During the Year:

Orpington Methodist Church continues to provide a range of services and activities for the whole community. Worship takes place every Sunday with provision for other services midweek. Service styles vary according to age group and occasion. There are regular baptisms and funerals, but less marriages. There are opportunities to study and pray in groups both at church and in people's homes.

The after school club and holiday club in half terms has attracted children and families. This year one of the themes was about reducing, re-using and recycling. The uniformed organisations run with maximum numbers — this is enabled by the willingness of volunteers whose commitment to training, supervision of activities and care is a significant contribution to the whole community.

Work continues to raise funds for redevelopment work with a total of £647,815 in funds designated to the redevelopment, gifts received or pledged and grants secured towards our target of £930,000. Further grant applications are being made alongside a continuing programme of fundraising.

Improvements to digital presentation and seating in the church have been accomplished through the year.

The church continues to explore how to make the best use of its facilities and has made new links with community organisations. Hospitality is at the heart of our work and this is expressed to individuals and groups in pastoral care and provision of amenities.

On the 31st August 2018 Rev David Gillman moved on to a new circuit; we are very grateful to David and Gillian for the tremendous work they have undertaken in their time with us. On 1st September 2018 the church welcomed a new minister, Rev Terry Wright and we wish Terry and Shirley well in their time with us. We also employ a part-time administrator and convener of children's work and a part time cleaner/caretaker, along with a wide range of volunteers to share in our ministry and outreach.

There are many people who give of their time, money and energy enable a diverse programme to be offered. The Church has 126 members and around 65 volunteers many of whom are also Church members. The church is supported by the Orpington and Chislehurst Methodist Circuit, the London District and the wider Methodist Connexion. We are thankful for the support of all those around us in helping us fulfil our responsibilities and realise our vision.

Public Benefit:

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit, 'Charities and Public Benefit'.

Financial Review

Reserves Policy:

Within General Reserves there are 3 main funds:

Society & Property Account £80,689 (2017: £102,599): We aim to ideally hold in reserve sufficient money to cover six months expenditure plus £20,000 as a capital contingency. The Church is dependent on voluntary donations and hall lettings to cover the costs of its ministerial team, property costs and general expenses. As this income and property costs can be volatile, this level of reserves is considered prudent to manage the day to day running of the Church in an organised manner and give time for thorough review if any difficult decisions have to be made. Six months expenditure plus £20,000 is £71,055, so at £80,869 reserves stand at 7 months plus £20,000

Legacies £41,654 (2017: £41,512): These are monies received through legacies which the Church Council will allocate to the work of the Church as it deems appropriate .The Church Council has decided to designate the balance on the Legacy Fund towards the Building Development Project.

Other Designated Funds £69,200 (2017: £5,000): This is made up of 3 separate funds; £44,700 is designated for use on the Building Redevelopment Project; £17,000 is designated to cover lost income when the Building Development Project goes ahead; and, £2,500 is designated towards improved Sound and Vision systems in the Church.

Within Restricted Reserves there are 3 main funds:

Building Development Fund £110,966 (2017: £47,432): A project to develop the potential of the Church building to create a flexible space in the Church, bringing the opportunity to tell the story of our faith in exciting new ways. A new bold entrance will allow immediate access and visibility into a renewed church. There will be much greater opportunities for worship, events and exhibitions and other activities to serve and involve the community.

Sound and Vision Fund £1,563 (2017: £0): money donated specifically towards

improved sound and vision systems in the Church.

Internal Organisations £18,544 (2017: £22,939): these are balances held by separate organisations within the Church who report to the Church Council and are restricted to the use of that organisation.

Financial Overview:

The Church's income was £237,097 (2017: £189,166), the principle components of which were offerings and taxes recovered, lettings and fundraising towards the Building Development project. The Church's expenditure was £135,526 (2017: £128607), the principle components of which were the Orpington and Chislehurst circuit assessment, expenditure on the Building Development Project and repairs, maintenance, utilities and insurance costs on the Church Buildings. The overall improvement in funds £322,616 (2017: £221,045) was mainly due to increased net fundraising on the Building Development Project, £63,000, and a one off donation of £25,000.

The Trustees decided in 2014/5 to develop the Church Buildings as described in the reserves policy above and submitted plans to the London Borough of Bromley to obtain planning permission. (Planning permission was successfully re-obtained in October 2017). In 2015/6 the Church worked with consultants to develop the technical design for the development. Fundraising continued for the project with an aim to raise £930,000 through donations, fundraising and grants. At 31 August 2018 £205,846 had been raised for the project out of which expenditure of £94,880 has been incurred through various firms of consultants in order to submit a planning proposal, completing the technical design and purchasing new easily stackable chairs for the Church. A further £441,969 has been pledged, earmarked or been offered as a grant when the development goes ahead. So at the 31 August 2018 the fundraising total stands at £647,815, 70% of the target. This includes grants totalling £309,000 offered by Orpington & Chislehurst Circuit (£200,000), London District (£50,000), The Methodist Connexion (£39,000) and The Garfield Weston Foundation (£20,000) for which we are very grateful.
