Trustees' Annual Report, Year ended 31st December 2015

In this our 25th year of operation the Trustees for the year under review are:

Chairman, Dr P.J.R. Cox; Vice Chairman, Dr M. S. Stead; Hon Treasurer, C E Buchanan; Mr S Small, Mr P T Chapman, Mr A Cottle, Dr R. G. Taylor, Dr D Ashton-Cleary, Ms H A Pitts, Mr A G Brown.

Provision of Life Support Equipment

It will be remembered that our raison d'etre is the provision of life support equipment to the ambulance service in Cornwall. In addition to our normal activities, for the past two years or so we have been providing and installing Public Access Defibrillators (PAD's) in many parts of our county. To date we have installed 91 PAD's which at £3,100 each equates to £282,000, plus fitting costs. We still have a long way to go and during the coming year we shall provide as many defibrillators as we can, in shopping centres etc, where there is a high footfall. Our overall aim is a target of another fifty units but this is entirely dependent on how successful is our fund-raising. In the past 12 months there have been a number in instances where the PAD has been triggered and used on a patient with good results immediately. Obviously, once the patient has been taken to hospital we don't know the outcome. Public feedback has been positive.

Fund-raising Events

In April we 'fielded' 19 runners for the Virgin London Marathon. As entry fees and other costs are considerable we asked each runner to raise at least £3000. As will be seen from the Annual Accounts each runner achieved twice that amount, on average. A truly exceptional result. The London Marathon event is of course our largest single fund-raiser but we attend many other notable events in Cornwall such as Morval Rally, Padstow Rally etc and we are also well supported by organisations such as Rotary International and the Lions.

Extra Curricular Activities.

We were approached by a local Rotary Club to help in providing three ambulances, which had completed their useful life, to be sent to Kosovo. As the charity is a strong contributor to the South Western Ambulance Foundation Trust we were able to secure three vehicles. We also approached some of our suppliers to enquire if they would contribute goods and equipment for this good cause. In this we had a good response and the three ambulances left the UK in September very well equipped.

Pre Hospital Trauma Life Support Courses (PHTLS)

It is apparent that not all ambulance trusts nationally provide these courses for their paramedics, or, if they do, not in any great number. FLEET has been a provider for the last twenty years and this year three courses have been undertaken. Feedback suggests they are well received by our paramedics which adds a further technical qualification to their CV. Overseen by the Royal College of Surgeons of England the qualification lasts three years and renewed after that time.

Premises at Lanivet.

Situated just outside Bodmin and next to the A30 trunk road this garage has proved to be a very valuable asset in improving the charity's performance. We have use of a redundant ambulance, equipped to the same standard as service vehicles, which we use to attend fund-raising events and which is stored at Lanivet.

FLEET Supporters

From the General Manager, Norman Trebilcock, down we are all volunteers and we are indebted to him for all his hard work and dedication. We are also fortunate in having a large number of supporters spread across Cornwall who have been instrumental in contributing to FLEET's success and enabling us to provide an enhanced service to everyone in the county. Our grateful thanks to them all.
