Trustees' Report

Annual Report to the Trustees

Annual General Meeting 1

26th May 2017

This is our first AGM. We have gone from nothing to something...

From 0 we have become 5 trustees – Anthony, Ruth, Veronica, Tom and myself, along with Glyn - minute taken, policy creater, general support (+ the occasional helpers e.g. Tim with the website, Ruth's husband - Andy with our logo and leaflet, choir folk with some admin support).

From nothing we have become a registered charity, an organisation with a simple aim – to provide Imagination Library books to local children. We are an organisation with a visual identity – with a logo, a leaflet, a website, a T-shirt, and a local presence - thanks to Ruth, Andy, Tim and the aforementioned people

What we have achieved

We have set up our first project – providing books to all the children who live at Turner House. In February 2016 we mailed our first books to children living at Turner House. So far we have provided regular books to 18 pre-school children who are living/or have lived there. (16 children are still with us and 2 have now graduated – meaning they have now reached 5 years old.) We have now mailed 174 books in total.

In terms of our fundraising:

Anthony's son - Adrian ran the London marathon. This then inspired us to gather supporters to run Hastings half marathon. 18 runners took part in Hastings half marathon. 3 runners participated in other half marathons (Headcorn, Brighton and Bexhill) and raised over £6000 for Imagine Nation to provide books to Hastings children. The Hastings Half Marathon in particular raised awareness of our charity — Sarah-Jayne's — Dolly Parton performance playing on the seafront on the stage provided by Ruth was fantastic. We looked good and local people are becoming aware of us.

We have also received money from other organisations and individuals who have heard about our work e.g. We were one of the house charities chosen by Marlborough House.

The Way forward

Turner House has been our test-bed. We now have set up a framework to build upon. We have a drafted memorandum of understanding – this outlines what we can offer and what we expect of our partner organisations in terms of commitment to getting books to children. Thanks to Tom we are set up to monitor the impact of what we do. Thanks to Veronica we have experience of collecting meaningful case studies. This is all helpful for applying for future funding/feedback back to our funders.

With the experience gained at Turner House and the money we have raised over the past year we are now in a position to start a new project. Subject to everyone's approval, I would suggest we go back to FSN to see if they are still keen to work with us to provide books... if not we need to find another self contained project via which to provide books.

In terms of future fundraising and awareness raising of what we do:

- Hastings Pier Event promises to be another great day in terms of fundraising and raising awareness of what we do. Ruth has worked very hard to create a day of fun activities, workshops, and performances
- delivered in partnership with Education Futures Trust. White Rock Theatre, The Library Service, Treasure Tots, Ed Boxall, Hastings Town Singers, Discovery Playground, Alexandra Park Greenhouse and the pier
- Hastings ½ marathon 2018

- We need to keep our ear to the ground to find someone to complete funding application forms (we could now advertise for this).... To move in a step by step fashion towards our aim of providing books to every child in Hastings and St Leonards.

To keep in mind the figure 3600. There are approx. 1200 live births per year locally. If we sign up 60% of Hastings chn there would be approx 3600 pre-schoolers signed up in Hastings and St Leonards, so to sign them all up with need 3600X25 each year. (£82,000 for just books). (Yr 1: 720 chn/£10,000) (Yr 2: 1440 chn/30,000) (Yr 3: 2160chn /£46,000), (Yr 4: 2880 chn /64,000)

Impact of receiving the books (1 person's feedback)

When the sun is shining Hastings can feel glorious. However, as we know, life in Hastings is tough for many of the children. Hastings ranks amongst the most deprived towns in the UK. We are already making a difference. Providing books gives local children a more positive start in life. These are the words of Miya's mum. Miya has been receiving books from Imagine Nation for over a year.

"Miya used to have speech problems but reading to her and repeating sounds helped. The health visitor said that receiving the Imagination Library books has helped Miya. The scheme has made me closer to Miya. She comes and sits close to me and snuggles in when I read to her. This helps me too. When I read it calms me down. I used to be quite an angry person but reading helps me to calm down.

I think it's a good programme and every child should be on it. I want Miya to be smart and do well in her life, not like me. I think enjoying books will help. Without the programme I wouldn't have started reading to Miya at such a young age. I wasn't a big fan of reading but then I saw how Miya enjoyed the books which she got. Now I read with her everyday" And not only is Miya's mum reading with her daughter everyday...inspired by her daughter she bought herself a "grown up" book to read herself.

So a big thank you to everyone here in this room.. and those who are not... With the combination of everyone's skill, support, ideas, enthusiasm, money... we have started to provide books to local children and we will now build upon this in the years to come.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Period Ended 2 July 2017

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005)', issued in March 2005, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006.

Fund accounting policy

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are those donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose.

Further details of each fund are disclosed in note 10.

Incoming resources

Voluntary income including donations and grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature is recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Costs of generating funds are the costs associated with attracting voluntary income.

Support costs

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources, for example, allocating property costs by floor areas, or per capita, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their usage.

Start-up costs

Start-up costs are accounted for on a basis consistent with similar costs incurred as part of the charity's ongoing business.

Where there are no similar ongoing costs, start up costs which satisfy the criteria under relevant accounting standards to be recognised as assets are included in the balance sheet. All other costs are written off as incurred.
