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<u>Chairman's Report</u> for the Year Ended 31st March 2018

Annual Report of the Trustees for the period 1st April 2017 to 31st March 2018.

I am pleased to present the Annual Report of the Trustees for the year ending 31st March 2018. Knowle United Charity traces its origin to the end of the 16th Century and provides financial assistance towards personal and community needs of public benefit within the ecclesiastical parishes of Knowle, Dorridge & Barston and the civil parishes of Balsall Common & Chadwick End.

An Annual Budget is agreed by the Trustees and formal Reserves and Investment policies are reviewed annually alongside a risk assessment analysis. These take into account the need for liquid funds and a contingency reserve, approximating to the annual rental income, required to service operational costs in maintaining the Charity's residential property portfolio and enable the making of grants.

In August the Charity's properties were revalued by Richard S Davy MA (Cantab) FRICS, a Trustee, at a figure of $\pounds 2,883,625$ as against his previous valuation of $\pounds 2,296,500$ in 2010, being an increase of $\pounds 587,125$. At the close of the year it was agreed to purchase the Leasehold of a property over which the Charity already owned the Freehold for $\pounds 140k$. This not only consolidates existing property investment but will yield a better investment return, both as to income and capital appreciation, than presently available in the financial markets. Whilst existing capital resources are sufficient to cover the costs the Trustees formally agreed to a necessary waiver of the current Reserves policy as a temporary measure. Completion had not taken place within this year of reporting with total costs, including refurbishment and essential repairs, anticipated to be in the region of $\pounds 160k$.

The principal source of income is Rentals from the Charity's 21 residential properties, let at market based rents and reflecting a high tenancy rate, totalling £131,063 (£124,922) within a total income figure of £135,115 (£134,544). Expenditure totalled £93,198 (£94,655) resulting in net Income of £41,917 (£39,889), however Note.9 in the Accounts refers to Commitments of £31k not yet accounted for. Major expenditure totals are Educational grants £31,000 (£30,660), Youth and Pastoral Care worker grants £18,035 (£16,520), Travel Grants £6,940 (£1,260), Christmas donations £4,080 (£4500) and property repairs and maintenance £14,043 (£23,094). Total funds taking into account the property revaluation and annual surplus increased to £3,113,952 (£2,484,910) resulting in the Charity maintaining a strong financial position albeit the liquidity position will be impacted by the aforementioned property purchase.

There have been no changes in the Trustees during the year and I take this opportunity to thank them for their support contribution to this worthwhile Charity. As previously reported our Clerk, John Chaloner, became an employee as from April 1st to comply with current regulations albeit his duties remain unchanged. We are fortunate to benefit from his many years service to the Charity and his experience is highly valued. Finally I am pleased to acknowledge the continuing professional support of our legal, accountancy and property advisers.

<u>Report of the Trustees</u> for the Year Ended 31st March 2018

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st March 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of investments which are included at market value, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

There are 21 freehold properties, 32,34,36,38,44,46,48,50 and 52 Station Road, 2a,2b,2c, 57, 79 and 81 St John's Close, 3a, 3b, 90,90a,96 and 98 Kenilworth Road, Knowle and freehold ground rents 83 and 85 St John's Close vested in Knowle United Charities. The original cost of most of these is unknown. 57 St John's Close was acquired during the year to 31 March 2001. During the year to 31 March 2002 the freehold of 57 and the other 3 maisonettes in the block 55,59 and 61 St John's Close was acquired.

Vested in the Official Custodian for Charities, but from which no income is derived, are 3.7 acres of land beneath the buildings known as Knowle Church of England Primary Academy.

In 2017 the properties were valued by Richard S Davy MA (Cantab) FRICS at a value of £2,883,625 and the trustees have decided to incorporate this value into the accounts.

The trustees do not consider that the value of the properties will fall and accordingly no depreciation is provided.
