Trustees Report for 2017/18

The year started with a commitment to the local village chief to build a footbridge for him and the local people. Work started in April, supervised by 2 of the UK trustees who are Chartered Civil Engineers. Additional help was arranged through their contacts in the UK and a total of 5 other volunteer engineers went to Malawi throughout the project. The bridge is a traditional brick/stone arch and was completed in 5 months using local skilled labour and local materials.

It was another busy time in Malawi at the start of the new school year and 4 of our children went on to secondary schools. We had a total of 13 children at secondary school and 3 at college!

It was with great sadness that our wonderful matron Mirriam Kamanga had to retire following an accident earlier in the year when she broke her ankle. Although she had expert medical care she was still unable to walk properly and could not return to work. We provided all treatment for her at the Beit Cure hospital in Blantyre.
