Providing support for Newham Foodbank and working with St Marks C of E to develop a drop in Wednesday hub for community members to come to get advice on issues they face such as benefits advice, housing and provide a safe place local residents in Beckton of all ages to interact ,combat loneliness and isolation over refreshments and a meal.

Creating Food4Me project for the elderly, housebound, low income earners and those struggling facing food poverty and live in Beckton and Royal Docks area.

Volunteers also helped to organise a health and well-being session for parents and carers of children with special needs and professional experts such as psychologists. Psychotherapists, mental health practitioners offered to provide information sessions.

Volunteers also supported with our Food4Me project collecting and distributing food to house bound, low income, vulnerable community members who were struggling ling to put food on the table


