Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 4th May 2018

Before the meeting started Ian asked that we note the death of Ted Rowell and Joan Kellett. Ted had been a committee member and Treasurer for many years and Joan had been a past committee and supported, also for many year.

Minutes of the last AGM meeting

The minutes of the previous meeting were read, approved and signed.

The Officers in post resigned and were re-elected without opposition and the Committee remained as before.

Finances

Barry circulated a copy of the accounts as at the 31st March 2018, which had been audited by John Graham. Although the accounts showed an excess of income over expenditure of £11,130.13, this was, in fact not a true figure as £15,000 of the income was grant money received in respect of the renovation of the cinema equipment. The true figure, therefore is an excess of expenditure over income of £573.

A general discussion took place with regard to letting fees for the hall, use of the gym and membership fees and entry fees for the cinema. After the discussion it was agreed by the Committee that the letting fee for the hall would remain at £8 per hour (except for affiliated groups such as Bowls and FitSteps which would remain at £7 per hour) as this was comparable to other venues in the Dale, the Gym use would remain at £2 per session. It was agreed that the membership fee for the Cinema Club would remain at £2 per year but entry to the cinema would increase to £2.50 per adult and £2 per child. This would cover, to a degree, the cost of printing the quarterly programme which is given to all members.

Barry then offered thanks to John Graham who audits the accounts every year.

There being no further business, the meeting closed.
