- 1. The Objectives of the Trust remain:
 - a) the advancement of education of young people in Zeals, Wiltshire and surrounding counties, in the local area, by the provision of training and advice to encourage personal development;
 - b) to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for education, recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for young people in the area of benefit.

- 4. The Governing Document is a Trust Deed Dated 2nd April 1997 and the most recent Constitution was signed by Trustees on the 7th December 2010. Trustees are appointed at the Annual General Meeting held in the Autumn.
- 5. The Trust supported the following Activities in 2017/2018
 - a. In recent years the Youth Club activities have faded in the village of Zeals and so the Zeals After School Club (ZAC) was created as a feeder towards the Youth Club and support to Whitesheet Primary School parents. This required initial funding but is now virtually self-funding with up to 20 children a day or some 60 a week. The ZAC provides after school activities and food, if necessary, for fee paying primary school children, from 3.15pm to 6pm, with some 3 paid Staff, trained to NVQ3, child minding, and 3 paid helpers, plus one Duke of Edinburgh's Award candidate and one youth volunteer. They use the Library, kitchen, lavatories and Community Hall facilities at Zeals Primary School but use predominantly their own equipment. The ZAC is fully

registered with OFSTED and have their detailed Policies in the OFSTED format. They have access to Zeals Primary outside areas and Swimming Pool and follow the Academy Trust Rules and Policies as well, as providing the chemical over view and qualified life savers. Our Trust bought a minibus in June 2016, with support from Wiltshire Council, who arranged that Seeds for Success (S4S), a Youth Working Charity in the local town of Mere, were to be allowed to use this Minibus for their fetching and carrying activities. We are looking at S4S, who have a paid youth leader and youth workers, as providing all our Youth Club activities, whilst the Youth Trust continues to provide specific activities and facilities around Zeals, for Youth and active people to use free of charge.

- b. We are currently training up Minibus drivers
- c. The maintenance and condition of the Zeals Green Pastures Sports Ground, with changing rooms, showers and kitchen, for amateur sport and training, including floodlight provision, and other external activities including school sports days, Scouts camps, recreation and leisure activities. The Zeals Football Club is the major regular user of the ground and gives opportunities for young players. They comply at all times with FA Rules and Policies, for which they insure separately. The team, although of mixed youth and adult age groups, has 25 regular players, and plays in the 2nd Division of the local Wiltshire League.
- d. Kayaking is provided for young people during the summer months with instruction provided by 2 fully qualified instructors using British Canoeing Rules and Policies. The primary school swimming bath is used for introductory instruction, followed by activities in the Frome Canoe Club. Some 12 or so children used these facilities over 10 outings in 2018.
- e. The Youth Trust maintains Insurance Policies covering all activities conducted by youths and public Liability for facilities, plus a specific policy for the minibus.

6. The Trust Policies are:

- a. A full set of OFSTED compliant policies used by the ZAC and subject to OFSTED inspection. The Youth Trust defer to these and a complementary set of Youth Trust Policies.
- b. Specific Youth Trust Policies:
 - i. Risk Management Policy
 - ii. Investment Policy.
 - iii. Safeguarding Policy.
 - iv. Policy for managing Volunteers.
 - v. Policy for Handling Complaints.
 - vi. Policy on paying Staff. The Charity pays 2 Trustees, as it has been agreed by the Trustees and donors that it is in the interest of the charity and provides a significant and clear advantage over all other options:
 - a. Treasurer/Book keeper: £100 a month
 - b. Project manager/Grounds manager/fund raiser: £125 a month.
- 7. Charities Policy on Reserves: In principle the Charity does not hold reserves as the Donors are willing to cover unforeseen expenditure but expect the Trustees to work to clearly planned budgets. However small sums are kept for contingencies and equipment replacement, within the bank account.
- 8. Our main source of income this year has been £25,221 in Donations, compared with £34381 in 2017, which reflects the additional £15000 or so spent on the football ground drainage and some start-up costs for the ZAC. Expenditure was £21,203 compared with £31,044 reflecting the same additional costs.

9. The Future 2017/2018:

- a. The year has been used consolidating the ZAC, the purchase of 4 youth Kayaks to encourage more activity and further efforts to get maximum value out of the facilities at Zeals Green Pastures.
- b. The future of the Youth Club lies, the Trustees believe, with the resources and Youth Workers of the Seeds for Success (S4S) charity and this embraces a wider catchment area in SW Wiltshire. The Zeals Youth Trust will continue to explore their Charity contribution in facilities, organised events and continue to run the Zeals Swimming pool out of hours and provide the Kayaking activity. Other new ideas will continue to be explored to pursue the Objectives "to help young people, especially but not exclusively through leisure time activities, so to develop their physical, mental and spiritual capabilities that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society, in our local area.
