TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 5 APRIL 2018

The Trustees present their report along with the accounts for the year ended 5 April 2018.

Structure, Governance and Management

The constitution of the charity is set out on page 1.

The Trustees who have served during the year and since the year end are set out on page 1. Future Trustees must be appointed by resolution of the Trustees.

The Trustees must hold at least one meeting each year.

A quorum at a meeting of the Trustees is three Trustees.

Decisions may be determined by a simple majority of the votes cast at a meeting.

Objectives and Activities

The Objects are to make donations towards or otherwise to promote or assist such charitable purposes and institutions as the Trustees may think fit.

Public Benefit

The charity Trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission and grants have been made during the year which have given public benefit to a number of charities with a wide variety of charitable objects.

Funds

The Trustees must use the income and may use the capital of the Charity in promoting the Objects.

Risk Review

The Trustees have continued to review and monitor the major risks to which the Charity is exposed. The Trustees have reviewed the major risk facing the Charity and believe that it would relate to a fall in investment income. The Trustees have addressed this risk by appointing investment managers whose performance is monitored by the Trustees.

Investments

The Trustees' investment policy has been to provide a stream of income available for potential distribution and a sound capital base for the long term future of the Charity.

Reserves Policy

The Trustees' policy is to apply the income year on year as it is received, so that expenditure broadly matches income received.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 5 APRIL 2018 (CONTINUED)

Financial Review

During the year investment and other income amounting to £94,820.57 (2017: £80,778.16) was received, and grants amounting to £90,000.00 (2017: £92,000.00) have been paid. The market value of investments at the year-end amounted to £1,275,261 (2017 £1,291,229) and the balance on the Stockbroker Capital account amounted to £9,867.52 (2017 £9,339.64).

Achievements and performance

The investment income received by the Trustees during the year has enabled them to make 51 grants of between £1,000 and £4,000 to charities with a wide variety of charitable interests, benefiting local, national and overseas communities. These have included further support to Friends of the Holy Land Institute for the Deaf in Jordan and to a worker of the Church Mission Society based in Ipswich, both in the sum of £4,000.

The flat which was purchased last year continues to serve its purpose. Small costs have been met to keep it in good condition. The refugee family have lived there for the whole of the year. International Care Network (ICN Registered Charity No. 1099400) continued to support them and along with Bournemouth Borough Council have been looking for more permanent accommodation for them to move on to, in which event the flat would become available for another refugee family.
