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#### HOPE CHURCH LUTON TRUST TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 31ST MARCH 2018

The Trustees present their annual report and the financial statements of the church for the period ended 31st March 2018.

#### AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The church's purposes as more fully set out in the objects which form part of the memorandum of association are:

- to advance the Christian faith
- to provide relief for those who are in conditions of need, sickness or financial hardship and who may be aged and to relieve the distress caused thereby;
- to advance education
- to provide, or assist in providing, facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of youth, age, infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life.

#### REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Church's aims and objectives and in planning future activities.

The Church operates in association with the Catalyst Sphere of Newfrontiers.

#### Worship and prayer

All are welcome to attend our regular Sunday services, when activities and groups are provided for children and youth, with a crèche for babies.

#### Major developments

- Open House attendance has grown and changed in character with many more men attending. Many who initially
  came to the drop-in are now serving in some way.
- We have started a new Sunday 4pm service which is very different in style. A separate team leads this; and it targets those we are working with in Open House and Azalea. It has established itself and regularly gathers around 15 people.
- Many more people have been released into leadership through community areas and the 4pm service.
- Activities overseas have continued with people going on our behalf to Spain, Ukraine, Vietnam, and Sierra Leone.
- We continue to be very active in the local community employing people paid for through grants to work into Hightown; to raise awareness of Child Sexual Exploitation amongst faith communities; run our Open House drop-in and to promote joint activities between Christian and Muslim youth.
- The day to day management of our work into Hightown and our work in Child Sexual Exploitation (FACES), including financial decisions are handled by executive boards of community representatives relevant to the project. Hope Church is represented on both these executives.

#### Major variances to budget 2017/2018

- Offerings are considerably down on both budget and last year. This is due to some members moving away and changed circumstances of others.
- We have not been able to maintain lettings at last year's very high level.
- Due to the reduced income we have not added to our staff numbers as planned.
- The amount given away to local and international causes is higher than the previous budget.
- Some equipment costs rolled over from last year.
- The community areas have not spent money on room hire, they prefer to use Hope Church Centre.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

As described in the later section on Structure, Governance and Management, Hope Church Luton Trust is a charitable company limited by guarantee, subject to the requirements of company and charity law.

#### **Income generation**

The church's total income for the year was £254,347 (2017: £235,420). Donations of £161,096 have been received during the year (2017: £173,521). Grant Income has increased to £63,483 (2017: £22,603). Net assets have increased by £38,518 in 2018 (2017: £10,345). The Trustees decided upon a change to accounting policy on depreciation of buildings in the year. This change resulted in a one-off increase to the capital fund brought forward for the year of £83,330 (Note 1 to the Accounts).

#### Investment policy and returns

The Trustees have wide investment power. The church's investment policy is to invest the monies not immediately required for the primary purpose of the Trust in, or upon, such investments as may be thought fit.

#### Reserves policy

The church holds unrestricted and restricted funds. Transfers are made from unrestricted to restricted funds in order to prevent restricted funds from going into deficit. Our overall policy for unrestricted funds is only to increase reserves above a minimum threshold necessary to operate the organisation (not more than 3 months expenditure) or where specific projects are being planned for subsequent years.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### **Governing document**

Hope Church Luton Trust is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 20<sup>th</sup> January 2010 and registered as a charity on 1<sup>st</sup> February 2010. The church previously operated as an unincorporated charity. The company was established by a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

#### Appointment of responsible individuals and elders

The Church is governed by its responsible individuals, who are appointed according to the Articles of Association. The individuals are closely involved in the church's operations and held regular meetings during the year ended 31st March 2018.

Elders are recognised by the congregation for the spiritual direction of the church, and these Elders together with other people in leadership were appointed as Trustees when the Church was incorporated. Day to day management is delegated to a team of senior staff and volunteer ministry leaders.

#### Trustees

The responsible individuals and elders, who are Directors for the purpose of company law and Trustees for the purpose of charity law, who served during the period and up to the date of this report are set out on page 3.

#### Trustees' induction and training

Responsible Individuals and Elders are closely involved in the church's operations prior to appointment and are appointed according to their ability to lead the church and the skills they bring to the post. Existing Responsible Individuals, Elders and new appointees have a good knowledge of the operation of the Church prior to appointment.

Responsible Individuals and Elders are aware of the legal requirements in connection with the charitable company. New appointees are supported in their posts by existing appointees. New appointees are also provided with copies of the Memorandum and Articles of Association, latest financial statements and guidance from the Charity Commission, including the Charity Commission guide 'The Essential Trustee'.

#### Risk management

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the church is exposed, in particular those relating to the operations and finances of the church. The Trustees are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate their exposure to major risk.

#### TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

The Trustees/Directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the charitable company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF HOPE CHURCH LUTON TRUST

I report on the accounts of the company for the period ended 31 March 2018, which are set out on pages 6 to 13.

#### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The Trustees (who are also the Directors of the company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The Trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed. The charity's gross income exceeded £250,000 and I am qualified to undertake the examination by being a qualified member of The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales.

Having satisfied myself that the charity is not subject to audit under company law and is eligible for independent examination, it is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the 2011 Act;
- to follow the procedures laid down in the general Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act; and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

#### Basis of independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the general Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as Trustees concerning any such matters. #### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the period.

#### 1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts. and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and with the Charities Act 2011.

#### 1.2 Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the church. Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal. Transfers are made from unrestricted to restricted funds as necessary to prevent restricted funds from going into deficit. The designated Capital Fund is unrestricted.

#### 1.3 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the church becomes entitled to the income, it is more likely than not that it will receive the resources and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the SoFA when receivable. Grants are included in the SoFA when the general income recognition criteria above are met and in the case of performance related grants income is recognised to the extent that the specified goods or services have been provided. Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the church where this can be measured reliably. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts. Investment income is included when received.

#### 1.4 Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT that cannot be fully recovered, which is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the church (as a charitable company) and include the audit fees and costs linked to the church's legal constitution.

#### 1.5 Fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Equipment and fittings:

25% per annum on cost

No depreciation is provided on freehold land or buildings.

Previously depreciation was provided on buildings at 2% per annum. The Trustees have determined that the value of the freehold building is in excess of cost and accordingly that depreciation is not required. Brought forward depreciation on the building (£83,330) has been restated therefore at £Nil. The effect of the restatement is as follows:
