Governance and Management

The charity is governed by the Trust Deed adopted on the 30th April 1957.

Her Majesty's Lieutenant for the County of Buckingham has the power to appoint new trustees. In practice, such appointments are recommended by the existing trustees having given due consideration to the skills and knowledge of the appointee.

The officials of the Friends are appointed by the trustees.

The trustees meet every four months to consider matters relating to the charity, in particular the reports from the Appeal Committee and the Inspection Committee. The latter responds to applications for grant assistance made to the trust by visiting the applicant church and submitting a recommendation to the trustees.

Objectives and Activities

The principal objects of the trust are the preservation and improvement of churches in Buckinghamshire. The objects are achieved by making grants available for the purpose of such preservation and improvement. Grants are funded from the net income and reserves of the trust. The trust is reliant on income from investments and various fund raising events including funds raised by the Friends.

The Friends of Buckinghamshire's Historic Churches is run as a separate organisation within Buckinghamshire Historic Churches Trust: under its terms of reference as revised by the Trustees in October 2013 the aims of the Friends are to raise awareness of the Trust; to involve more people in its activities and to raise funds for the

trust. Under the terms of reference once a year the Friends transfer to the Trust any sums held in excess of £3000.

Achievements and Performance

The trust continued to make grants to various churches for preservation and improvement projects. In the light of the increase in criminal damage to church roofs the trustees agreed to make available grants of £500 to those churches who had been subject to such criminal activity and now wanted to install alarm systems to deter future attacks.

During the year the trust made 21 grants to a total value of £71,500 of which 11 were main grants to a value of £66,500 and 10 roof alarm grants to a value of £5,000.

Involvement with the national "Ride & Stride" event raised a net figure of £10,988 and the Sumer reception raised a total ££5,823.

Income from investments amounted to £33,785

The Friends collect subscriptions from members and raise money through organised events; other donations are accepted from individuals and churches to further the work of the Trust. Gift aid on subscriptions and donations is claimed by and paid directly to the Trust. A report from the trustees of the "Friends" appears later in these accounts

Financial Review

During the year the trust had a deficiency of income over expenditure of £11,005. The value of investments increased by £6,983. Total funds reduced to £868,840 (£872,862 in 2017) The funds are regarded as unrestricted.

The Friends had a excess of in income over expenditure of £613. The Friends funds stood at £5,670 at the year-end (£5,057 in 2017)

Reserves Policy

The trustees seek to maintain the level of reserves at such a level as to generate sufficient income to maintain their grant making at a level that will provide meaningful support to church restoration projects. As far as is possible all surplus income is used to fund grant making in the same financial year. However, the trustees will consider making grants using funds from reserves where the application is regarded of being of exceptional merit or urgency.

Public Benefit

The trust has referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing its aims and objectives and in planning future activities. In particular, the trustees consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives they have set.

Friends of Buckinghamshire's Historic Churches Report for the period 1st May 2017 - 30th April 2018

Objectives

The Friends of Buckinghamshire's Historic Churches is run as a separate organisation within Buckinghamshire Historic Churches Trust: under its terms of reference as revised by the Trustees in October 2013 the aims of the Friends are to raise awareness of the Trust; to involve more people in its activities; and to raise funds for the Trust. This is the ninth report since the Friends were founded in 2008; this year marked 10 years since the Friends was established.

Activities

The details of the financial activities are summarised in the associated accounts. The revised terms of reference stipulate that the chairman is to be a trustee and that the hon officers of the Friends are to be appointed by the Trustees. The Friends collect subscriptions from members and raise money through organised events; other donations are accepted from individuals and churches to further the work of the Trust. Gift aid on subscriptions and donations is claimed by and paid directly to the Trust. Under the revised terms of reference once a year the Friends now transfer to the Trust any sums held in excess of £3000. Accordingly, in October 2017 the Friends transferred £5,000 to the Trust in respect of which the Trust was able to claim Gift Aid of £859.

By the end of the reporting period there were over 200 Friends, many of whom regularly support Friends' events. During the reporting period only one Friends' event was held and that was a well attended church crawl in August 2017 which took in St Mary's Amersham, with a guided tour of the Drake Chapel; Chalfont St Giles with its wall paintings; and a hard hat visit to St John the Baptist, Little Missenden, where the extensive conservation work on its wall paintings was in progress. The crawl was once more led by trustee Roger Evans, Chairman of the Appeal Committee who has led a number of crawls for us but has decided that this was to be the last. The annual lecture for 2017 sadly had to be cancelled. Details of all events are regularly updated on the Events section of the website.

In the early months of 2018 the Committee prepared for GDPR, and were fortunate to get a 75% response rate from Friends. The exercise was completed by a thorough overall of records during 2018.
