Structure, governance and management

The trustees of the Association are fully responsible for the overall management of the Association and they meet regularly to manage its affairs.

The Charity Commission requires trustees, within their Annual Report, to sign a declaration that during the year there were no serious incidents or other matters that may impair the activities, beneficiaries, property, work or reputation of the Association and that should have been brought to the attention of the Commission but have not. (sections 11 and 48 Charities Act 1993).

The trustees actively review the major risks which the Association faces on a regular basis and believe that maintaining reserves at their current levels, combined with an annual review of the controls over key financial systems, will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions

The trustees have also examined operational and business risks faced by the Association and confirm that they have established systems to identify, mitigate and duly report any significant risks.

The future responsibility for recording any serious events or the potential problems will lie with the Secretary of the Association in liaison with the Chair of Trustees.

The Trustees confirm that there have been no serious risks identified or brought to their attention during the year

Under the trust deed the association has the power to make investments as the trustees see fit.

Objectives and activities

Review of the Year

The year was the 125th Anniversary of the charity. Although the type of aid provided by the charity has changed, the needs of the residents of the Borough for food, fuel and household goods remains the same over 125 years later.

The trustees express their sincere thanks to:

all members past and present who have given the charity practical support

the financial supporters over the years without whom our efforts would be severely limited those potential members who might join us in the years ahead to enhance and maintain the work of the charity

The very special anniversary for the charity was commemorated with a Dinner at the Imperial Hotel. The event gave members and their guests the chance to celebrate the work and achievements of the Charity.

There have been many changes for the Trustees, firstly Tony Shaw finally succeeded in stepping down as Chair of the Board of Trustees after more years than Tony cares to remember. Everyone is grateful to Tony for his leadership and support.

One new Trustee was appointed, Mrs Joanne Wells. Mr Graham Goldstone-Creasey agreed to move to the vacant position of Treasurer. Since the financial year end Graham has regretfully had to relinquish his post as Treasurer due to personal commitments after 1 years tenure. He will be missed and we wish him well.

The Trustees met three during the year and two of the meetings were attended by Directors of Gore Browne our Investment Managers (GBIM Ltd). During the year the Trustees reviewed the investment policy and concluded no changes were necessary.

The value of our investment portfolio decreased by 4.1% (from £422,669 to £400,105 an decrease of £22,564) This was largely due to the fall in many markets since the end of January 2018 and was not unexpected. Investment income was £12,599.

The Trustees have agreed that it is important that Association maintains, as far as possible, the value of our investments as the returns which they provide (£11,744) as this is a major part of the income required to fund the support offered to clients. In this respect the Trustees would like to express appreciation to our Investment Advisors (GBIM of Harrogate) who keep a careful watch on our portfolio and attend meetings of the Trustees to personally deliver their advice and support.

The Trustees remain grateful to those members of the Entertainments Committee who this year generated a splendid £11,488 (2016-17 £10,286) as a result of their hard work and efforts.

The Association is grateful to the many donors who support our good work.

We continued to benefit from the John Slater Foundation, St Annes Church PCC, Blackpool South Trefoil Guild, Barbara Hardy, Mr & Mrs Fairhurst, Mr & Mrs Wilkinson, Fulfilling Lives, Mr & Mrs Simmons, GBIM and donations in memory of Barbara Whalley.

To all of the, both corporate and individual, we are most grateful.

During the year we provided support to the sick and poor of Blackpool to the tune of £27,404 The majority of this (£20,300) was in the form of food vouchers and fuel payments with the balance (£6,744) in the form of material help with household items and living costs.

YEAR ENDED 31st MARCH 2018 NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005)', issued in March 2005, applicable accounting standards and the Charities Act 2011.

Fund accounting policy

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

Further details of each fund are disclosed in note 12.

Incoming resources

Voluntary income including donations and grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature is recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Investment income is recognised on a receivable basis.

Income from charitable activities includes income recognised as earned (as the related goods or services are provided) under contract.

Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Costs of generating funds are the costs associated with attracting voluntary income. Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs

Governance costs include costs of the preparation and examination of the statutory accounts, the costs of trustee meetings and the cost of any legal advice to trustees on governance or constitutional matters.

Support costs

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources, for example, allocating property costs by floor areas, or per capita, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their usage.

Investments

Fixed asset investments are included at market value at the balance sheet date. Realised gains and losses on investments are calculated as the difference between sales proceeds and their market value at the start of the year, or their subsequent cost, and are charged or credited to the statement of the financial activities in the period of disposal.

Unrealised gains and losses represent the movement in market values during the year and are credited or charged to the statement of financial activities based on the market value at the year end.
