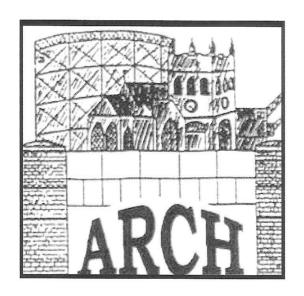

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing Document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 6th April 1998. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objectives and the powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1 which is towards the costs of dissolution and the liabilities incurred by the charity while the contributor is a member.

Recruitment and Appointment of Management Committee.

The directors of the company are also the charity trustees for the purpose of the charity law and under the company's Articles are known as members of the Management Committee. Under the requirements of the Memorandum and Articles of Association the members of the Management Committee are elected to serve for a period of three years after which they must be re-elected at the next Annual General Meeting.

The management committee all reside within an area known as Garston Under the Bridge, this being their geographical boundary or catchment area. The Management Committee are all from different social backgrounds in an effort to maintain a broad skill mix, the Management Committee are requested to provide a list of their skills, which are updated every year.

Trustee Induction and Training.

All Trustee's are already familiar with the practical work the charity delivers. However they are encouraged to partake in any training courses that will benefit the company's operational framework. New trustees or volunteers partake in an induction course which covers the key roles of trustees and volunteers, courses are also provided on:

Objectives and Activities.

The Objects of the Charity are

To promote for the benefit of the public of Merseyside without distinction of sex, race, political, religious or other opinion by the provision or assistance in the provision of education and training opportunities.

Facilities in the interests of social welfare

Advice, information and assistance in relation of citizenship

To carry out any other charitable objects that can advantageously be carried out in conjunction with the objectives first described.

Services and Activities carried out during 2017 to 2018

Funding from LCC has enabled ARCH to continue delivering the Little Dibbers growing food scheme, based on Chapel House Farm allotments. The project is aimed at 7 to 8 year olds from both local primary schools (Banks Road County Primary School and Holy Trinity R.C Primary School). The children have successfully grown and harvested produce, i.e. potatoes, onions, Leeks, tomatoes, melon, cabbage, peas, carrots, parsnips, garlic, lettuce, radish and strawberries. The children have also taken part in 'Apple Day' tasting different apples from around the country and then identifying were the apple was from and how far it has travelled. The Little Dibbers Allotment Growing scheme successfully hosted an open day event aimed at parents and family members. This event is to showcase all there produce grown and to display their photo imagery of what they have been doing throughout the course of year, plus display their feedback on what they liked and disliked about the project and what could be changed for the following year.

Potters growing scheme funded by LCC, is aimed at older vulnerable and isolated people is very successful in the local area. This is mainly due to the majority of homes having small back yards, plus there is a huge demand for an allotment plot and the waiting list is closed. The Potters scheme has benefited the member's health and well-being. By meeting new friends, increasing their social network, they have become more physically active by using different muscles (bending, stretching, carrying and digging) kept their mind active by researching different products, eating a healthy diet from locally grown produce and they have learnt to take notice of their environment, the flora and fauna of the area, food-miles and how to grow food locally. The group also celebrated the BIG LUNCH; this event was open to all the community, family friends and allotment holders.

Through funding from MPAC (Merseyside Action for Play Council) ARCH has been able to deliver an Allotment Playscheme during school holidays. On average 12 to 18 children from different age groups have taken part in fun creative activities i.e picking, preparing and cooking their lunch, making bird boxes & mini-beast hotels, recycling plastics in water features. Tie dying with foods and paints. Nature walks, working the allotment site – digging collecting manure planting and harvesting produce, jam making, pumpkin carving and aluminous day of the dead tea-shirts are just to name a few. Feedback from the children's evaluation forms was that they loved these activities and would love for them to continue.

First step Out: Aimed at bereaved & isolated members of the community.

Funding from Liverpool City Council (CRU) has enabled 12 bereaved members of the Garston community to gain access to a Tuesday coffee morning session were local members take part in 'Decision making' and implement their choices of activities throughout the year. This year the group engaged in the following activities: Annual 2 week holiday to Rhodes, trips out to Wales, luncheon outings to local establishments and a long weekend (Tinsel & Turkey) to Folkestone, Bruges and Canterbury.

The group volunteered to bag 1000 apples and oranges ready for the Christmas street float. Some members of the group have also taken part in informal computer sessions. This has enabled the group to get online, opening up there social networks therefore combating isolation. They have also learnt how to bank and shop online.

Arch has continued to work in partnership with all lead agencies within the Speke, Garston area. During the past year ARCH has implemented, coordinated and engaged with local organizations and community members in the events listed below to ensure cohesion and inclusion.

VOLUNTEERS

This year ARCH has had 9 dedicated volunteers to help with events and projects. As with our working partnerships, sponsors and funders we appreciate all their time, help, support and guidance as without them we could not achieve or deliver the projects and events, meeting our deprived communities' needs.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal Funding Sources.

The principal funding source for the charity is currently by way of grant funding from Liverpool City Council, this source of funding is presented as a 'restricted' income. During 2017 to 2018 ARCH received grant funding of £10,000.00 - The table below demonstrates how the grant of £10,000.00 has been used.

ARCH also carries out community projects or events which generate income from local groups for example Liverpool Housing Trust, South Liverpool Housing; these are also set out as 'restricted' incomes on the Companies & Charities accounts.

ARCH provides help and assistance to community groups or resident groups in writing bids to secure funds for their local events. These groups may not have a bank account, therefore if their bids are successful the cheque is placed into ARCH's bank account, which are set out on the Company, Charity Accounts as 'Restricted'. Receipts are collected from the group/s and sent to their funders with an evaluation report. The community/resident group/s and ARCH also have a file copy for future reference.

Reserves Policy

The Management Committee has examined the charity's requirements for reserves in light of the main risks of the organization. It has established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds held by the charity should be between 3 and 6 months of the expenditure. Budgeted expenditure for 2017/18 (based on moving premises, inflation and rising capital costs) is £27,049.00 and therefore the target is £6,762.25 to £13,524.50 in the general funds. The reserves are needed to meet the working capital requirements of the charity and the Management

Committee are confident that at this level they would be able to continue the current activities of the charity in the event of a significant drop in funding. The present level of reserves available to the charity is £nil. Although the strategy is to continue to build reserves through planned operating surpluses, the Management Committee is well aware that it is unlikely that the target range can be reached for at least 10 years. In the short term the Management Committee has also considered the extent to which existing activities and expenditure could be curtailed, should such circumstances arise.

Independent Examiner

Mr S. Whiteside has been re-appointed as the charitable companies' independent examiner during the year and has expressed a willingness to continue.

This report has been carried out under section 145 of the Charities Act 2011 under the direction given by the Charities Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act, and in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006 relating to small companies regime.
