Trustees' Report

Structure, Governance and Management

The charity is a charitable organisation governed by a scheme dated the 14th May 1976 and approved by the Charity Commissioners.

Recruitment, appointment, induction and training of Trustees

The names of the trustees who acted during the financial year 2017/18 are as follows:-

Ex-Officio Trustee - Father Ross Northing

Co-operative Trustees – Diane West Jeremy Stafford

Nominative Trustees – Judith Hildreth Maggie Evans

There are 5 trustees, one ex-officio who is the Vicar of the Ecclesiastical Parish All Saints, Calverton and two co-opted trustees who must have regard to the skills, knowledge and experience needed for the effective administration of the charity and their terms are for five years and two nominated trustees by the Calverton Residents' Meeting whose term of office is for four years.

All new co-opted trustees are identified and appointed by the existing trustees and they consider that the new trustees have the experience and ability to contribute to the management of the charity. Any competent trustee may be re-appointed at the end of their term of appointment.

All new trustees are made aware of the Charity Commission website and the booklet "The essential trustee, what you need to do".

All trustees are given a copy of the Scheme and latest accounts of the charity.

Trustees consider the budget for the year at their January Meeting.

The trustees carry out an annual review of the risks which the charity may face, have established systems and procedures to mitigate any risks identified and minimise any potential impact should any identified risks materialise.

Objectives and Activities

The charity makes grants to individuals who are resident in the Ecclesiastical Parish of All Saints, Calverton.

The income of the charity is applied in relieving either generally or individually persons resident in the Ecclesiastical Parish of All Saints, Calverton who are in need, hardship or distress by making grants of money or paying for items, services or facilities which will reduce the need, hardship or distress. Preference should be given to widows or apprentices.

Achievements and Performance

The charity owns 3 properties and have carried out the necessary maintenance work during the year.

The income from the properties have been used to make grants as set out above.

Financial Review

The results of the charity for the year are set out in the Receipts and Payments on page 1 of the accounts.

Reserves policy

The trustees aim to achieve a positive level of free reserves, as the income from the properties owned by the charity has exceeded any unavoidable expenditure.
