We also seek to relieve persons who are in conditions of need or hardship, or aged or sick, and to relieve the distress caused thereby in line with Biblical principles.



These meetings are mostly led by our minister, Pastor David Pfeiffer, and take place at our church premises. Other activities have included :- • Weekly (in term-time) sessions for the "Whaddon Lights" childrens choir, made up of children from the local area • Bi-weekly hymn singing at a local care home • Bi-weekly ladies' meetings which involve bible study and refreshments • Periodic "kids' fun days" for children from the local area • Periodic international evenings for international students from the local university • Periodic "Christianity Explored" courses

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves	The accounts show a surplus of income over expenditure of £10,814, but that was only made possible by grants obtained from various sources of £19,600. Future grants are anticipated from only one of these sources, and at a much lower level. (Grants to date in 2018/2019 are only half of the funds received in 2017/2018).
	The underlying result is that in $2017/2018$ the income significantly exceeded the expenditure, which meant an overall increase in the cash reserves inherited from the predecessor church from £28,439 in 2017 to £39,253 in 2018. A deficit is likely to be reported for 2018/2019 due to lower grant funding as mentioned above.

As and when the finances permit an increase in reserves, a building renovation plan is anticipated, as there are doors and windows that need replacing.
