Formation of Easingwold Community Library Association

In 2016, following a stringent financial review of Library Services, the decision of North Yorkshire County Council (NYCC) was to retain only three libraries and where possible, offer other libraries to their local communities. The only way to continue running a library in Easingwold was the formation of a volunteer run Community Library.

A steering group, with the responsibility of forming a community library was established from volunteers at a "Save the Library" public meeting,

Easingwold Community Library Association (ECLA) was formed and registered with the Charity Commission as a charitable incorporated organisation (CIO) on 14 December 2016, with a Charity Registration Number of 1170759.

The Library was formally taken over from NYCC on 1 April 2017 and after a short period of reorganisation and refurbishment, opened for business on 11 April 2017.

Organisation

The Library (ECLA) is managed by a committee (the Management Committee), which includes four trustees*, and operation is governed by a formal constitution. In future years, trustees will be appointed and reappointed at the Annual General Meeting. *At the 2018 Annual General Meeting, it is the intention to increase the number of trustees to six.

The Library is operated and managed entirely by volunteers.

Funding

Easingwold Community Library (ECLA) has been operating for one year and initially received assistance with "set up" grants from North Yorkshire County Council and Hambleton District Council. However these funding streams will not be available next year or in the future. However, ECLA is continually looking for possible grant aid opportunities and has benefited from a "Locality Grant" from North Yorkshire County Council.

In the first year of operation the library also received generous donations from the public and has set up a "Friends of Easingwold Library" organisation where members pay an annual subscription.

ECLA has also registered for Gift Aid.

Further income is generated by leasing a spare office in the library building to the Easingwold Town Council.

Also, a relatively small income is received from book and media reservations, fines for overdue books and book sales etc.

Future Expenditure

Easingwold Community Library (ECLA) is responsible for all energy and operating costs, business rates, insurance and building maintenance and repairs. In addition, the aim is to gradually improve and upgrade the premises as finances allow.

Easingwold Community Library Association (ECLA) provides the premises and facilities to accommodate the local Library Service. This is the old library building leased from North Yorkshire County Council. ECLA provides a library service at least equal to that previously offered by NYCC

The service provided by the community library involves the loan of books and other media – talking books and other media (e.g. films on DVD etc.), and is available residents of North Yorkshire of all ages – children, young persons and the old and elderly and is fully accessible to the disabled. There is also a home delivery service for the housebound and elderly.

There are also four desk top computers on which operating time can be booked.

The Library service also includes the provision of information, and where possible advice and advocacy, providing facilities for the Citizens Advice Bureau.

Within the Library, a discrete children's library facility is provided, and a group for pre-school children, called "Poppets" operates weekly.

In general the activities of the library provide a service which fosters and encourages the appreciation of books, literature and associated matters for the whole community, and in planning these activities for the year, we (the Trustees) kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

During its first year of operation, April 2017 to March 2018, the Easingwold Community Library (ECLA) has provided all library services previously met by the North Yorkshire County Council library service. Opening times operated by the previous organisation have also been maintained, and facilitated the volunteer operated home book delivery service for the housebound and elderly.

Several book related events and readings by authors were held to promote interest in the library.

The library successfully took part in the national "Summer Reading Challenge" designed to encourage children's reading .

The library ran a weekly group for pre-school children – "Popetts" – to introduce them to reading and use of the library, via play, educational and craft activities.

The community library has also provided facilities for the Citizens Advice Bureau to operate an advice clinic, presently on a monthly basis.

ECLA has provided office facilities which are leased to Easingwold Town Council, providing an additional income source.
