Report of Accounts 2018

Good morning. I extend my usual thanks to Peter Lainton for the help he gives me in collating monies and banking them. He is very meticulous and that obviously helps me enormously. Can I also thank those who so carefully count the collections for us every Sunday, particularly Ashley and Brian. And not forgetting Stuart Jones who inspects our accounts so diligently.

Having given you a week to look through the accounts I propose to highlight a few matters and leave you to raise questions over matters that interest you.

Total **income** in 2018 was up by £3613. This is particularly good when you consider that we did not have the benefit of the Talent Initiative which raised £6428 in 2017.

The main benefactor of this increase was our Boiler Replacement Fund which received £7617, a very positive start in its first year. Our target is £11,000.

In addition our planned giving increased by £2209.

The income from Hall lettings is very healthy at £11,864 (£10,773 in 2017).

Our two Fairs raised £4852, the profit from the Summer Fair of £1902 having been allocated to the Boiler Fund. The Community Café surplus was up by £362 (£4112).

PCC fees were up by £1674 (£3092) and there were no legacies

Overall the total **payments** this year were more or less the same as 2017. However, I comment on the following fluctuations.

- Parish Share up by £1532
- Charitable Giving Overseas was down £1264. By way of explanation in 2017 we donated £1123 to Water Aid following our Harvest appeal. At Harvest in 2018, rather than cash, we had a very generous collection of goods under our Harvest of Hygiene appeal. Charitable giving at Home was up £167.

- Upkeep of the Church was down by £1370
- Upkeep of the Hall was up by £1762

In conclusion - on the plus side we have:

- A very compassionate congregation who continue to respond generously to appeals and who give freely of their talents and time to do the many jobs around the Church.
- We have a good start to our Replacement Boiler Appeal.
- We have a well administered Church. I think we should be very proud of our Vicar who is able to run our very active Church so professionally with Admin costs contained at £6757.

On the flip side

- We need to continue to address and increase our income through our planned giving and social fund raising.
- We need to continue to be prudent in managing our expenditure
- We need to continue to maximise our rental opportunities with the Church Hall
- The PCC is already addressing these on your behalf but I am taking this opportunity to increase your awareness and thereby gain your support for our endeavours.
