### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 31 MARCH 2018

## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Phoenix French Bulldog Rescue, also known as Phoenix FBR, registered charity no 1171943, operates in England, Scotland and Wales to assist in the rescue, rehabilitation and rehoming of French Bulldogs in need or at risk. The group was formed in December 2016 as an online organisation, operated by volunteers giving their time freely to help in this common cause. Charity status was granted in March 2017 with 4 Trustees appointed to support this work.

#### **OFFICERS**

The officers who served the charity on the Committee during the period were as follows:

All Trustees are related to each other except for Mrs Butler, who offered her assistance having been involved with charitable military causes and for her love of the French Bulldog Breed. Sadly, feeling that her age (retired) was not in her favour and finding herself unable to help in the capacity she would have wanted to do, Mrs Butler offered her resignation in the second quarter of 2017. This was very sadly accepted

It was decided that another Trustee would not be sought at that time as Phoenix was operating well with a Management Team of individuals across the UK who each have their own team of Regional Coordinators (also volunteers), who assist in the daily running of the rescue. The Management Team are instrumental in all major decisions affecting how the charity is run and how the dogs are managed, and so with this effective cooperative working system in place Phoenix will continue to run with 3 Trustees.

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

The aims and objectives of the charity is to offer a home to any Frenchie (or crossbreeds thereof) in need, but also to educate the public on this wonderful breed, promote good ownership and to help keep Frenchies at home with their families wherever possible.

## **RISK ASSESSMENT**

The Committee has identified that it is exposed to normal risks, and in doing so has established control systems, which comply with the requirements of current legislation in order to manage those risks.

#### **FINANCIAL REPORT**

Income for the year totalled £76,511 with expenditure of £76,241 resulting in a surplus for the year of £270.

## **REVIEW OF THE YEAR**

During 2017 Phoenix FBR needed to launch itself to the public in a very visible way and so much advertising was done and events were attended to raise both funds and profile. Results from 2018/2019 will show that this has paid dividends. Phoenix has been able to join forces to help promote greater awareness in the breed as well as helping to address other wider issues such as breeding licenses and animal cruelty, namely Lucy's Law and Finn's Law. We continue to support projects for the betterment of animal welfare.

In 2017 Phoenix FBR helped to rescue 117 French Bulldogs – the figure for 2018, to be confirmed in next year's accounts will show this has risen alarmingly.

Vet bills remain our biggest and most necessary cost and we see no change to this but actively seek to keep costs to a minimum without sacrificing animal care; to this end we have formed a partnership with PDSA for vet costs and AHT have been very kind in dramatically discounting complex surgeries.

#### **FUTURE PLANS**

In the year ahead we will look to build our base of foster-homes in order to help dogs in need and to find creative ways of raising awareness and funding to allow us to further our work. We shall also be looking to fully implement Gift Aid and examine our position relating to VAT.

#### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### a) Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102).

The charity meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note.

The accounts have been prepared on the going concern basis.

#### b) Income

All income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income.

 Donations and legacies are received by way of grants, donations, and gifts, and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable.

#### c) Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. It includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates:

• Charitable activities comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries.

## d) Fund accounting

Funds held by the charity are either:

Unrestricted general funds Funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable

objects at the discretion of the trustees.

Designated funds Funds which are set aside for specific purposes by the trustees

to be used in accordance with the charitable objects.

Restricted funds Funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes

within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular

restricted purpose.
