The PFA works closely with the school and the head teacher Mr Britten who is an active participant by attending meetings and liaising with staff to support the PFA in its events and activities.

We hold regular committee meetings with the trustees and organise parent coffee mornings to announce updates and gain feedback.

An annual AGM is held in October and positions are elected.

Section C Objectives and activities

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The objectives of the PFA are to raise funds for equipment and activities for pupils within the school who have a variety of disabilities, not provided from statutory funds.

In furtherance of this object the PFA will develop more extended relationships between staff, parents and others associated with the school.

Development of school, staff, pupil and parent relationships:

The PFA hold termly coffee mornings:

- To update parents of PFA activities and to provide a relaxed environment for parents to socialise as a majority of the pupils are provided with a taxi service hence there are no parent socialisation at school drop off and pick-ups.
- Occasionally in the coffee mornings professional therapists are invited to give guidance and support to parents in relation to their child's disability.
- For the wider community we too invite hosts to inform parents of various external disability activities available in the community.

Main PFA activities:

We held our annual Christmas fayre with a Santa's grotto, Easter eggs giveaway and Sports day stall. These stalls and events are extremely popular to the pupils and their parents/carers with many supporting the PFA by attending and purchasing refreshments and items.

The PFA lottery and the moneyboxes are steady and simple fundraisers with many parent supporters.

We provide and maintain 2 caravans at Kiln park; one being wheelchair accessible for the pupils and families as a retreat. It is located in a rural location with access to various outdoor amenities. It is a popular facility because it provides a retreat for many families who may not be able to afford holidays or accommodation which are accessible for the disabled.

The PFA produce a termly newsletter to promote and inform parents and staff.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Fundraising

The PFA supported 3 main fundraising events in the year:

- Taff Trail is an annual school community bike event which raised £3172 towards a bike trail nearby the school. Our school staffs are a key role in this event, volunteering their dedication to raise funds. Participants are a mixture of staff, parents and people in the wider community.
- The Surf experience fundraiser lead by staff member Dan Wilmore who paddle boarded around the Welsh coastline, 145 miles raised £3824
- The moneyboxes raised £559 from loose change and mainly from parents and the wider community.

Donations:

In the wider community various establishments support the PFA with their kind donations to achieve our objectives.

- Caravan donations from the school and the pupils families using the caravan raised £10,182.00p
- Deloitte, an established financial company with offices in Cardiff, Wales and the Mary Homfrey Charitable Trust donated £2000.
- GC Gibson grants donated £2500.
- Sports day raised £75.
- Christmas fayre with Santa's grotto raised £1996.
- School lottery £1924.
- DM Thomas grant donated £3125, a restricted amount dedicated to pupils for equipment to help achieve their Duke of Edinburgh awards.
- Red Dragon centre in Cardiff bay donated £65

Parents and staff are extremely supportive, volunteering and dedicating their time to fundraise and support the PFA.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Ysgol Y Deri Parents & Friends Association – Charity No 1072900

I report on the accounts of the School for the year ended 31 August 2018 which shows a balance on the bank account at that date of £56,101.91.

Respective responsibilities of the trustees and the examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act)) and that an independent examination is preferred.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts (under section 145 of the 2011 Act)
- to follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act and
- · to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes considerations of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
