Trustees' Report

Objectives and Activities for the Public Benefit

To relieve persons in the area of Redcar and Cleveland who are in condition of need, hardship or distress (beneficiaries) by providing practical support, information, guidance and in such other ways as the trustees from time to time see fit.

Achievements and Performance

Clearly it has been 12 months of significant change. A highlight was the move to new premises in central Redcar. This initiative has raised awareness and visibility of Footprints. We are in a strong position to build on a remarkable year.

'Redcar Foodbank', 'Next Step' shop, and 'Footprints Café, have focused on the hardest-to reach and most vulnerable. We raised our profile in several ways, such as working with the 'Mighty Redcar' BBC show.

'Men's Shed', 'Redcar Beacons' and 'First steps', demonstrate that our projects are increasingly innovative in the way they deliver programmes on the front line. Practical support, turning hopeinto-action.

At the same time, we are seeking to make our long-term development programmes better than ever. The 'Fresh-Start' packs, the 'Lunch box' scheme and launch of the new 'Dementia café' are all examples of this.

We are also partnering with more organisations to deliver sustainable change. Because in working together, we <u>can</u> make a difference to Redcar.

But even though we have made big strides forward this year, our area is going through a challenging period. The leadership and organisation are determined to make Footprints an outstanding charity, so that we are best able to rise to the opportunities ahead of us.

The trustees/directors have considered the guidance produced by the Charity Commission on the provision of public benefit and they confirm that public benefit has been provided by the range of activities as described.

Financial Review

The Charity's financial results for the year are shown in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA), Balance Sheet and Notes to the Accounts.

Risk Management

All major risks are identified through a risk assessment process and systems have been put in place to mitigate these risks. The Trustees recognise the uncertainty over future income as the main risk facing the Charity. Grants are sought from a variety of funders as opportunities arise to reduce the dependence on any one source of funding.

Reserves Policy

Though there is no policy in place at this time, steps are being taken to ensure it will be up and running before the end of the next financial year.

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Plans for the Future

The trustees and volunteers continue to target the local community to focus on marginalised people Our move to new premises will help this. With that in mind, we are developing an updated strategy that will see us unify our projects and make them far stronger than the 'sum of their parts'.

The trustees aim to ensure adequate finances, staffing and volunteers to provide an excellent level of service. Footprints in the Community will continue to raise funds through activities and applications to charitable funders. This especially affects the Footprints Community Café and our expansion of outside catering

This is how we are working to improve and strengthen our reach and the ways we engage with people. Clearly, this is an exciting time for 'Footprints in the Community.'

1 Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

Basis of Preparation

These Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective January 2015) – Charities SORP (FRS 102).

Footprints in the Community meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note(s).

Incoming Resources

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when:

- the charity becomes entitled to the resources;
- the trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources; and
- the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability

Donations are only included in the SOFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.

Capital Grants are released over the economic useful life of the asset to which they relate

Resources Expended and Liabilities

Resources expended have been analysed using a natural classification.

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

2 Funds

The Charity has three funds, an unrestricted general fund, a designated fund for expenditure specified by the trustees and a restricted fund used for expenditure specified by the funder: hence all movements on each fund are disclosed.
