1. Structure, management and governing document

The trustees who held office during the period 30 June 2017 to 31 August 2018 and the governing document are detailed in the charity information on page 2

2. Objectives and activities

The main objectives of the charity as set out in the governing document are:

- a. The relief of sickness and the preservation of health, in accordance with a Christian ethos in and around Capel St Mary by the provision of Parish Nurses.
- 3. Achievements and performance

The main achievements of the charity in the accounting period were:

- a. To make the position of Parish Nurse a salaried one.
- b. Recruiting and training volunteers to work with the Parish Nurses Team.
- c. Serving the community of Capel St Mary by the provision of advocacy support, health education, increasing and maintaining safety and independence within the home and setting up a monthly Hope Hub café to support those with mental health issues.
- 4. The policy of the trust is to maintain 6 months of expenditure as free reserves.
- 5. Funds

The reserves include earmarked grants received for specific purposes which were underspent at 31 August 2018. The value of these has been carried forward for spending in the next accounting period. Grants involved are those for over 65s, tackling loneliness and dementia friendly communities.

6. Public Benefit Statement
