Status of Charity

The Trusts are administered by twelve Trustees, comprising The Lord Mayor for the time being of the City of Exeter, the Ex-Officio Trustee; Four appointed by the Council of the City of Exeter, each for a term of four years, at an appropriate meeting of the Council; Seven co-opted by the Trustees, each for a term of five years, who must live or carry on a business in or near Exeter.

In consequence, we have a good balance of Trustees, with experience in Banking and Investments; General Practice Medicine and Nursing; Local Authority Housing, Education and Local Politics. We are also privileged to have three Aldermen, including the former Head of Exeter City Council, as well as the Rector of St Leonards Parish Church.

The Trustees appoint a Chairman and Vice Chairman, each to serve for a term of 2 years, and appoint members to a Finance Sub-Committee to meet as and when required.

The Exeter Church Charities, formerly known as the Exeter Municipal Charities (Church List), is governed by various Schemes of the Charity Commissioners as follows:-

The Exeter Charities (Church List) Almshouse Charity Scheme of 1st May 2003, amending that of 19th July 1995, which consolidated the Charities of Eliza Ann Rice, Flaye's, Lethbridge's and Davye's United Almshouses;

The Charity of Lawrence Seldon founded by will of 8th May 1598 and regulated by a Scheme of 16th April 1970;

The Charity of Lawrence Bodley DD (including Gifts of Thomas Mogridge and Mary Wotton Copp) established by Schemes dated 29th January 1884 and 30th March 1899.

Activities and Objectives

The primary objectives of the Charity are to provide affordable housing, principally for those aged 55 and over; to relieve poverty by means of money and other grants to individuals; and to provide assistance to Incumbents and Curates in financial need. In all cases the primary area of benefit is the City of Exeter.

Income is obtained from quarterly dividends on invested endowment funds and, in the case of the homes (formerly known as almshouses), also from contributions made by the residents towards the cost of repairs, insurance, management and other outgoings. The homes comprise six Grade II Listed one-bedroom houses known as Lethbridges in Parr Street, Newtown and four two-bedroom houses and eight self-contained one-bedroom flats known as Flayes in Pinhoe Road, Whipton.

At the discretion of the Trustees and as funds allow, in accordance with Orders of the Charity Commission, part of the annual income from the residential accommodation is set aside for the cyclical and extraordinary repair and improvement of the homes.

The Charity is an active member of the Almshouse Association, whose advice and help they are always grateful to receive.

Review of the Year

The objectives have been maintained throughout the year in accordance with the schemes of the Charities.

The Trustees continue their adherence to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, with the almshouse residents continuing to benefit from the provision of well-maintained, good quality, affordable housing and other beneficiaries continuing to be assisted where needs are identified.

Quarterly meetings of the Trustees were held in July and October 2017 and January and April 2018. In addition, the Finance Committee met in September 2017 to review the year's accounts and review the 5 year plan.

Alderman Margaret Danks has remained as the Chairman for her second year in office and from January 2019, Mrs Dilys Baldwin will become the Chairman and Alderman Norman Shiel will become the Deputy Chairman.

One of our Trustees, Mr Kevin Butler, has suffered a debilitating stroke and has been unable to attend meetings. However we have been pleased to receive his continued advice and input on such matters as the Charity's Investments and Kevin remains a valued member of the Trustees. Also, following the retirement of the Reverend Bessent, we were delighted to welcome the Bishop's Appointed Trustee, the Reverend Simon Austen.

Mr Andrew Crossley of Cherry & Cherry, who is a Chartered Surveyor, has continued in his role as the Surveyor and Clerk to the Trustees, ably assisted by his wife, Lynda Crossley, who is a Chartered Accountant.

Quarterly Trustees' visits continued to be made to both Flayes and Lethbridges. In most instances, the Residents were at home and able to give a warm welcome and an encouraging word. Issues affecting the Residents were raised during the year with the Clerk's office, although none necessitated any immediate action by the Trustees.

There have been no new Residents' Appointments this year and none of the Residents have expressed a desire to move; the Trustees take this as a positive sign that the Residents are happy and content. Some of our Residents are getting more elderly now but they are comfortable in their homes and the Charity does its best to give them help when needed and, in doing so, we view ourselves as being more than just a housing provider.

This year our main building works' project was the start of the external redecorations of Flayes, which had not been redecorated for nearly 20 years. The work was competitively tendered for and the best quote was received from one of our own Residents, Mr Tony Farrant, who has been busy throughout the entire summer; the Trustees are very pleased with the splendid job that he has done. The project will also have been carried out within the budget, which was £20,000 including the scaffolding and materials.

Two grants were made from the Seldon's Charity during the period under review and the Trustees made a single grant from the Bodley and Mogridges' Charity to assist an Ordinand within the Exeter Deanery with his costs.

The Trustees have examined the major strategic business and operational risks which are faced by the Charity and have established procedures to mitigate these risks. This included reviewing the buildings', Trustees' indemnity and other relevant insurance cover to ensure their continuing adequacy and suitability, and arranging appropriate service contracts to comply with their obligations under gas safety regulations. A major point of focus for the Charity this year was the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), which the Clerk reported on in some detail and, after consultation with the Trustees, implemented the Charity's own policy.

Details of the income and expenditure in the various housing and non-housing charities are as attached to this report. The total reserves at the end of the financial period were £3,137,292 (2017 - £2,971,858); of these the income reserves, being determined as the net non permanent endowment assets of the charity, totalled £349,027 (2017 - £284,477).

For housing, the budgeted surplus of income over expenditure for the year was £33,890. However the actual surplus for the year was £42,315. Apart from the overall costs coming in on budget, the main reason for the additional surplus is because the Almshouse Association recommends we budget for 7½% of our residents' income to be lost through non payment of the maintenance contributions and void periods. However our Residents are generally good at making their payments on time and we have had no void periods.

We have just come to the end of year 3 of our 5 year plan and at the end of year 5 we had planned for a surplus of just under £150,000, for future maintenance and refurbishment costs. However at the end of year 3, this surplus is currently £130,000. The Finance Committee is not however complacent about running too large a surplus because building costs continue to rise steadily and there is always the possibility of unforeseen costs arising. In 2019 the Trustees will be preparing the next five year plan, which is due to start in July 2020.

2. During the year an additional 326.39 COIF Accumulation Units (Extraordinary Repair Reserve) were purchased at a cost of £50,000, the average price per unit being 15329.57p.
