The Members of the Executive, who are also the Trustees of the charity and the directors of the company, have pleasure in presenting their report and financial statements for the year ended 30 September 2018.

THE CHARITY

Black Minority Ethnic Television, Film and Media (BME TVFM) is a non profit voluntary organisation. It is registered with the Charity Commission under numbe 1099419. Charitable Status was obtained on 19th September 2003.

BMETVFM is a Foundation with strategic aims. It has launched a series of foundation and learning opportunities that had a clear path towards employment in the creative industries or elsewhere. We are here to support disadvantaged communities with fewer opportunities in the work place, with fewer learning opportunities and with fewer recreation and leisure opportunities.

REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS AND ACTIVITIES DURING THE YEAR

Last year in our Annual Report to the Trustees, I stated that having secured our investment for Phase 2 of ourheritage.tv , we will broaden the scope and reach of the project and make that content more widely available than ever before. Again I am delighted to report that Phase 2 of the project was successfully completed and a complete history of the Black and Asian community in Britain from 1900 to 2018 was achieved . A first of its kind ever produced in Britain and a resource now supported by figures from the Media, Parliament, entertainment, sport and of course the wider community. This included the launch of the first ever heritage app for Black and Asian History. An app that is available both on the Apple and Google platforms. This is an outstanding achievement and one that was praised by our Sponsors, the Heritage Lottery Fund and finally an achievement delivered on time and completely within budget.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The deliberate decision of the Trustees to focus on delivering the next stageof our historic project impacted on our capacity and availability to pursue other projects. Our successful delivery of the same within budget and on time, means we can return to seeking wider support for new projects that are in keeping with our overall priorities and charitable objectives.

FUTURE

Software and IT will continue to be the focus of future growth and opportunity in the creative industry and we are determined to ensure that our young people benefit. We are also seeking to work with other organisations to provide more opportunities for young people in sport particularly around education and work opportunities. Helping to tackle child and young people poverty in London will be a particular focus of our work in the year ahead.

The Executive Board will prioritise the enhancement of our new Hertiage App as we maintain our wish for it to evolve as a potential source of investment income within the next 3 years. This will be in line with our successful development of the first online Black & Asian Heritage Archive – www.ourheritage.tv

RESERVES POLICY

The Executive is committed to maintaining a level of reserves that is accordance with its charitable objectives.

RISK ASSESSMENT

The Trustees continue to keep the Charity's activities under review and monitor performance, with particular regard to any major risks which may arise. The Trustees have assessed and categorised the risks which the Charity is, or may become, exposed to in order to ensure that there are satisfactory systems established to mitigate those risks.

A review of risks will be carried out by the Trustees on an annual basis in order to ensure that the process is constantly reviewed and updated.

1. ACOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the revaluation of freehold properties and investments. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) issued in 2000, 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' and applicable accounting standards.

b) Basis of consolidation

The financial statements incorporate the assets and liabilities of the Charity's subsidiaries as at 30 September 2018 and their results for the year to 30 September 2018.

c) Income

Income relating to the internet television project which includes forgone fees, is accounted for as received, unless it relates to future periods, in which case the appropriate portion is carried forward as deferred income. Other income is accounted for as received.

Income represents amounts receivable net of VAT where applicable.

d) Expenditure

Direct charitable expenditure comprises direct expenses incurred on the defined charitable purposes of the Charity and includes volunteer expenses directly attributable to the charitable activities.

Fundraising and publicity costs are those incurred in promoting the Charity and its activities both internally with the members and externally in the industry with the intention of attracting additional members and funding.

Support Costs comprises expenditure in support of the objects of the charity.

Management and administration costs include expenditure on compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Expenses are included on an accruals basis.

Where costs cannot be assigned entirely to direct charitable expenses, fundraising and publicity, support costs or management and administration, they have been allocated between these categories on the basis of time spent on these three areas.

e) Restricted Funds

These are monies, which have legal restrictions on their use where donors have specified the funds can only be spent on certain of the charity's activities.

No emoluments for services to the Charity were received by any of the Trustees or volunteers during the year. Trustee received received reimbursed expenses during the year against their travel cost and other expenses reasonably incurred on behalf of the Charity.

Owing to the continued presence of volunteers to support the London Council Projects, the Charity benefitted significantly by way of reduced administration costs. However the additional Project Costs were in relation to implementation of phase 2 of the Our Heritage online and app.

There were no staff costs to the Charity for 2017/18. All Management Costs relate to employing outside Project Specialists – Coaches, Trainers, Guest Speakers etc....

3. TAXATION

The Black and minority ethnic televesion, Film and Media is a registered charity and as such is entitled to the exemptions from tax afforded by section 505 ICTA 1988 and section 256 TCGA 1992 so far as its income and gains are applied for charitable purposes.

4. RESTRICTED FUNDS

The restricted funds relate to expenditure designated for specific projects. These were for Radio Broadcasting and Basketball Also the investment made by i2i Technology was exclusively towards the development of the Internet Television Channel.

5. SHARE CAPITAL

The charity does not have any share capital.

6. TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS

This relates to the website www.bmetv.net which is in the top 0.6% of worldwide websites according to www.internetlivestats.com. This is based on number of unique visitors per day and current Alexa.com rankings. In addition the development of the only online Black & Asian Heritage Archive www.ourheritage.tv offering 24 hour programming and other features which has now been added to with the first Black & Asian Heritage App.
