Charitable Incorporated Organisation

The Rock Christian Centre CIO was registered by the Charity Commission on October 8th 2015. On January 25th 2016 all the assets and liabilities of the former governing charity number 1086749 'Church on the Rock, Sheffield', were transferred to Rock Christian Centre.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is governed by its trustees, the minimum number at any one time being three. The trustees comprise of the church elders; the treasurer and any other person who has a significant financial management role in the charity - (currently the Chairman of Burngreave Foodbank.) The charity employs a full time Senior Pastor and Assistant Pastor, plus part time Foodbank Coordinator and an Administrator. Day to day running of the charity is carried out by the Pastors assisted by the Foodbank Coordinator, Administrator and a large number of volunteers.

Public benefit

The trustees have given due regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission in respect of public benefit when fulfilling the objectives of the CIO.

Objectives and activities

The object of the CIO is, for the public benefit, the advancement of the Christian faith in Sheffield and such other parts of the United Kingdom and the World as the Charity Trustees may from time to time decide.

Activities, achievements and performance

The third year of activity of the Rock Christian Centre CIO has been a year of steady growth and development.

Finances - During 2017/18 there has been a steady flow of donations to the General Fund and Building Fund. There has been increased expenditure from the Building Fund for the professional fees relating to the progress of our building project. We are thankful that the extra expenditure has been matched by generous donations to the building fund. There has also been increased expenditure from the General Fund to cover the cost of re-orientating our current church facility to accommodate the increasing numbers attending our regular Sunday services.

Sites & Buildings - The church has been able to sustain the costs of operating from four buildings on three separate sites.

On May 4th 2018 the 'Fellowship of Evangelical Churches' assigned their leasehold of the Handley Street Chapel to the Rock Christian Centre CIO. The lease is for 172 years from 25th March 1966. No capital payment was made for the assignment of the lease. In April 2018 the 'Word4Weapons' gun and knife amnesty bin was installed at the Handley Road site.

The building project to join the two buildings at the Spital Hill site to form the new church and community centre has made slow, but steady progress during the current year. The professional services of a Structural Engineer and Architect have been employed and a Soil Investigation Report undertaken. Electrical & Mechanical Engineers and a Quantity Surveyor will be employed in the future to obtain accurate costings for future funding appeals.

The planned Burngreave Foodbank store extension to the former library building was delayed by the unfulfilled promises of Kier Construction Ltd. who had promised to undertake the ground works and foundations as a charitable gift.

Church services and larger events remain at the original Carlisle Street site. The church offices, Burngreave Foodbank; smaller training courses etc. are located at the Spital Hill site. The Lighthouse project for addicts and homeless, and Breakthrough Prayer meetings are held at the Handley Street Chapel.

Church & Congregation - Due to the growth of the congregation, the Carlisle Street building was re-orientated to provide an extra 30+ seats. The numbers of under 18s attending the church reached 100+ with three sets of twins and several other babies being born to the congregation during the year.

At the beginning of 2018 a new 2020 VISION was launched with specific aims and commitments outlined alongside our mission statement and core values. The 2020 vision continues to be based on the Biblical example of the early church in Acts 2:42-47 and is separated under 4 titles. Growing Up in Maturity; Growing Together in Community; Growing Out in Evangelism and Mission; Growing Larger in Numbers. A specific part of the 2020 VISION is to see the new church building completed by the end of 2020. The church recognises our total dependence on the Lord if this vision is to be realised.

During 2017/18 there was a substantial increase in the numbers of people and children registered on our ChurchSuite database. By the end of October 2018 over 230 adults and 100 children were registered on the system.

Core church activities in addition to the regular Sunday services included Children's and Youth groups; Youth Club; Growth Groups; Breakthrough Prayer; Monthly Prayer Walks; The Lighthouse outreach; The Alpha Course; the RCC Filipino services; Friendship First Course; Ladies Meetings and lunches; Weddings; Funerals; Street Pastor training courses; Church family rambles; International Harvest Feast etc.

The Burngreave Foodbank, (affiliated to Trussell Trust), continued to serve the local community providing, (in the year up to October 31st 2018), 23,118kgs of food for 3,370 local people, 1,073 of whom were children. A significant number of volunteers from the church and local community are actively involved in the work of the Foodbank including the Tesco Foodbank Collections. Significant challenges were faced during the year with shortages of volunteers and the need to store food in multiple rooms and buildings due to the urgent need for the new foodbank store. In the light of the increased demands on the Foodbank, the trustees agreed to fund a small increase in the part time hours of Miss Rachel Snow who is employed as the Burngreave Foodbank Manager.

The Lighthouse project has provided support, Christian witness; breakfasts, food, clothing, showers to a significant number of vulnerable people over the year. The Lighthouse is operated by a team of volunteers from the church, under the leadership of Miss Sandra Black who was appointed during 2018.

The installation and commissioning of the Word4Weapons gun and knife amnesty bin at our Handley Street site attracted media attention with South Yorkshire Police; The Police & Crime Commissioner; The High Sheriff of South Yorkshire and other dignitaries at the launch. A good number of knives, weapons and needles have been taken off the streets. The bin has been featured on BBC Look North as well as in print and radio.

Financial review

The trustees are satisfied with the financial position of the charity. Considerable further work on the property is planned and during the year donations of approximately £48,000 have been made specifically towards this outcome. It is noted that the balance of unrestricted funds has risen by a little over £10,000 during the year. At the year-end unsecured loans totalling £118,000 were outstanding, due for repayment in between one and twelve years. It is the policy of the trustees to maintain free unrestricted reserves sufficient to cover three months' normal expenditure

Plans for future periods

The church's objectives for the future are detailed in the 2020 VISION and are clearly displayed on the church notice board and website.

The building project continues to be a major focus of the church. Phase 1 – the construction of a small extension to provide a Foodbank store. Despite frustrating delays we hope that the funds will be raised so this extension can be completed during the next financial year. Funding applications for Phase 2 – the main building project – are on hold until the detailed plans and specifications can be completed.

The new building facilities will give great opportunity for new outreach and community projects. However, most of these cannot be commenced until the new facilities have been constructed.

Notes to the Financial Statements

Year ended 31 October 2018

1. General information

The charity is registered in England and Wales as a charitable incorporated organisation. The address of the principal office is 177 - 195 Spital Hill, Sheffield, S4 7LF.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Disclosure exemptions

(a) No cash flow statement has been presented for the company.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular future project or commitment.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

Notes to the Financial Statements (continued)

3. Accounting policies (continued)

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the
 contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual
 requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case
 it may be regarded as restricted.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.
- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking
 activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those
 support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable
 activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

Tangible assets

The property is held under a number of long leasehold agreements and is amortised by reference to the period of the leases.

3. Accounting policies (continued)

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Fixtures and fittings - 25% reducing balance

Impairment of fixed assets

A review for indicators of impairment is carried out at each reporting date, with the recoverable amount being estimated where such indicators exist. Where the carrying value exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is impaired accordingly. Prior impairments are also reviewed for possible reversal at each reporting date.

For the purposes of impairment testing, when it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, an estimate is made of the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. The cash-generating unit is the smallest identifiable group of assets that includes the asset and generates cash inflows that largely independent of the cash inflows from other assets or groups of assets.
