ANNUAL CHAIRWOMAN'S REPORT TO 31 JULY 2018

Ladies & Gentlemen

I am very pleased to welcome you all to our 2nd AGM meeting this evening and to see so many of you here.

Compiling this report has demonstrated to me how far we have progressed this year and how we have built on the foundations of our first year.

We started this 2nd year with a few changes in our Committee, myself stepping up as Chair, Ann Taylor and Dianne Noble joining the committee and of course Vic Howell rejoining us. Of course not forgetting Teresa, Susan, Len and Mike who remained on the committee.

Our first year gave us a good foundation but in our 2nd year, we knew that at the heart of everything we do-we needed to start raising funds to ensure that we are able to sustain the library service and the building. I am delighted that we have been very fortunate this year with grant applications and fundraising. So I thought it would be useful to share with you exactly what funds have been secured this year.

Successful Grant Applications

- October 2017 Blaby Community Grant of £3000
- ➤ December 2017 LCC community Climate Change grant for £2462
- ➤ LCC Contingency Fund of £10,040
- ➤ Lottery Grant of £5212
- ➤ We have been lucky enough that the Parish Council that given us a grant of £1000 again this year in addition to providing ground maintenance costs of £1370. I would like to acknowledge and thank the Parish Council for their continued support.

Fund Raising

➤ Co-Op Green Token Scheme – you may all remember that we were one of the three charities at the beginning of the year – in the Co-Op scheme – all our volunteers and supporters took the opportunity to ensure that we grabbed tokens to pop into the SCL box in both the Sapcote & Stoney Stanton Co-Ops and we were lucky enough to get the most tokens and therefore successful in securing a cheque for £4000.

- ➤ Blaby Lottery This year we joined the Blaby Lottery and we now have a regular 25 tickets sold every month where a % of the money comes directly to the library, we are receiving an average £50 per month as a source of income and already have had 12 winners
- We have continued to be lucky enough that the local Allotment gardeners have kindly donated surplus vegetables and plants for us to sell and we have to date raised £188
- ➤ We have also taken on the cleaning ourselves this year and this has saved over £3000.
- We continue to sell donated books and this year have raised £431
- Finally as many of you will know, we have just been awarded a grant from Garfield Weston of £44,000 which will enable us to make significant improvements to the building with the plan to provide a disabled compliant toilet and refurbishment of the whole kitchen area. Watch this space on that one.

All in all I think you will agree we have been very successful in this area and Susan will confirm later what the current financial status is. With the grants and fundraising I would like to especially recognise and thank Vic Howell who as our fundraiser has worked tirelessly putting in a phenomenal amount of hours to secure all of these monies.

The building

As many of you will know before we took over the Community Library, the building had had almost no work or investment since it was built in 1970's and so many of the facilities required upgrading. You have heard about the successful funding applications and this has enabled us to greatly improve the fabric of the building and to bring the building up to date and provide an attractive and modern facility.

These improvements include replacing single glazed windows with new double glazed windows, new window blinds, loft insulation and new LED lighting in the library. We have managed to replace the oil fire heating system and the noisy boiler (which you will all remember) with new gas heating which even included having gas installed in the library.

I hope you will agree the library is now a much more welcoming and warm building because of these changes.

Events this year

We have continued with events started in our first year including Monday Coffee Morning and Children's Story Time.

I am pleased to say that at every school holiday period we have provided activities for the local children, we always aim to have a theme relating to a book and we are really learning what works well and where we need to make changes.

In addition, we are always looking for new activities to offer to bring customers into the library, and this year we have introduced:

- Knitting Group which started in the last couple of months and now has a regular group of ladies attending.
- Quarterly lunchtime talks with a variety of authors and speakers on a number of subjects all of which have been well attended. I think maybe the delicious scones and coffee added to the enjoyment of these raising £505. This is something we are already planning to continue for next year.

Summer Reading Challenge – this year we actually doubled the number of children taking part compared with last year. This was favourable compared with other libraries who saw a fall in the number of children taking part.

Summer Fayre

We held our 2nd Summer Fayre organised with other village groups and I am pleased to say that the event was again a great success and enjoyed by all and the library raised £680.

Garden

Work has continued on the library garden, we now have established perennials that will grow and flourish every year as well as constantly changing the bedding plants to give us colour. We continually receive excellent comments about how lovely our garden is looking.

We also managed to tidy up the side garden by clearing and resurfacing the garden with a stoned area which now gives us a different texture and look. I am personally proud to say this was completed as part of a teambuilding initiative with my own HR Team who thoroughly enjoyed their day away from the office but helping the local community. Although it was a sweltering hot day and hard work we completed it in just one day and had a lot of fun.

I would like to acknowledge and thank Ann Taylor for all she does with the garden, which she does in addition to looking after the book sales and now also running the knitting group.

Marketing & Publicity

We have been lucky enough that Mike Lee has taken on our publicity this year. He ensures that we are regularly promoting what we are doing in all the local publications.

Best Community Library Award

We are extremely proud to have been awarded Runner Up in the Rural Communities Awards and whilst disappointed that we didn't win, all our volunteers can be very proud of what we have achieved.

Policies and Procedures

All policies and procedures have been reviewed and updated accordingly including data protection and safeguarding children and vulnerable adults.

Recognition of some of our volunteers

This year we have seen 6 children volunteering at the library as part of the Duke of Edinburgh scheme, and I have really seen the difference volunteering makes – the DoE youngsters leave us with more confidence.

I know that I didn't know most of the volunteers until I joined this team and I know that that we all take a pride in our library. You all take a great personal-pride and enjoyment in what we are achieving and I am proud to be part of this team.

I especially want to recognise three of our volunteers who I remember recruiting right at the beginning – David Allinson, Keith Smith and Jean Kirkland - all of them volunteer here at the library usually on two shifts every week of the year and have done so for the last two years. They have contributed 100's of hours each over the last two years.

I want to take some time to acknowledge all our volunteers who help in so many ways – I am so appreciative of what you do. The social impact is very evident here in the sense of belonging and purpose that all of you take with the running of the library.

So finally, for all of you whether you are volunteers or Friends of the Library we are very grateful for your support, comments and suggestions that help us to run the library service and encourage us to continually keep reviewing and adding new activities and events.
