Within this period an average of 200 children aged 4-16 attended the charity's weekly Arabic Language lesson on Saturday school.
10 students who had completed 5 years at the Saturday school sat their Arabic GCSE. All achieved A* or A grades.
We have 16 volunteer teaching assistance helping in the classes which taught by 16 teachers employed on a seasonal, self-employed basis

The accounts have been prepared on the Receipts and Payments basis.
