Highway One Trust and Shelter Community share the objective of creating stable accommodation of a decent standard for people in housing need. In 2018 Highway One Trust and Shelter Community signed an intention for lease for a property in Chiswick.

Shelter Community has a good relationship with Nightstop (De Paul UK) in London. This is an organisation specialising in emergency accommodation for young people.

There is an informal partnership with the Swiss charity "Stiftung 34". This charity is a fundraising trust that supports different social projects in Switzerland and other European countries. This partnership allows Shelter Community to raise funds in Switzerland.

Our Vision

Our vision is to create a home for young people in which they can flourish and grow in their personal and social skills.

The issue

The housing crisis is one of the greatest challenges facing London. Finding suitable accommodation as a young person can be overwhelmingly difficult and many are forced into a disruptive cycle which can have a negative impact on their education, employment, health and well-being.

Our response

Our response is to create a safe and secure home which provides quality accommodation that can help young people affected by the housing crises to stay in education, training, as well as getting a job and enabling them to find more sustainable housing in the future.

We believe that we all need a "Shelter Community" in the midst of our life storms and that certain things can be best learnt in a community. By connecting our creativity, talents and resources we can become the Shelter Community that protects and transforms lives for good.

Emergency Accommodation

The main activity in 2018 was to offer two bedrooms for young people in need of an emergency accommodation or supported lodging. We are still operating on a small scale.

- The project leaders Jeannine and Stephan Wiedmer are approved hosts of DePaul UK project Nightstop. Nightstop provides emergency accommodation for 16 to 25-year-old young people in safe homes. In addition to the emergency accommodation of Nightstop we had two different young people stay for supported lodging.
- We have built up relationships with other organisations working in the same field and raised funds for the project.

Expansion

One key focus in 2018 was to find a property for the long-term future to increase the capacity. We were able to sign an intention for lease with the charity Highway One Trust for a property in Chiswick.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Emergency Accommodation

In 2018 we provided **240 safe nights** (emergency accommodation) for **21 young people** who would otherwise be on the street or in unsafe places.

One of our young guests wrote the following letter:

"I am so lucky to see S. today. When she told me that she's staying with you I was crying and realized how much I miss you!

I have some news for you (3) I've got my place. It is not a hostel, it is a normal accommodation!

I've started my college 3 weeks ago and enjoy it a lot! Miss you all a lot!! Hope you're well. I will always remember you. Love you so much."

Supported Lodging

The charity was also able to offer supported lodging to **two young people** and in total provided **76 days of supported lodging**.

Expansion

In 2018 Highway One Trust bought the Elliot Hotel (Bed & Breakfast) in Chiswick with the intention that we could use that property in the future for young people in housing need.

Highway One Trust and Shelter Community signed an intention for lease agreement and a planning application has been submitted to Hounslow Council to adapt and enhance the building and make it usable and attractive.

The property has been out of action for many years. The building is currently in a very poor state of repair – it has no central heating, a lot of damp and is unmodernised in every respect having been badly neglected over 25 years. Our plan is to transform that old guest house into a home for the next generation.



We have created an internet site for the project (ychlondon.org) and held an information evening in September 2018 for neighbours and supporters. The name for the project is "YouthCommunityHome" and we hope to create accommodation for up to nine young people and the caretaker family.
