TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 31ST MARCH 2018

The Trustees of the Charity present their annual report and accounts of the Charity for the period 1st July 2017 to 31st March 2018.

Governing Document and Constitution

The Charity is a Community Interest Organisation and is governed by a constitution adopted on the 26th April 2017.

Organisation Structure

The Charity is managed by a Board of Trustees which meet regularly. The Trustees of the Charity are listed on the legal and administrative page. The Board of Trustees are ably supported by the project manager.

The Charity acquired all the assets and liabilities of the unincorporated charity Faversham Assistanve Centre FACE on the 1st July 2017.

Objectives and Activities for Public Benefit

The Charity's objectives are to offer practical help to the elderly and disabled who are financially challenged in Faversham and the surrounding neighbourhood. (including some areas close to Faversham in bordering Sittingbourne

The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained at the Charity Commissioner's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Charity's objectives.

Achievements and Performance

The past 9 months have been disappointing for FACE, we had to vacate our previous office premises and have been unable to find a new permanent home, we are at present using a office at Faversham library one day per week. This set back has not effected our clients. KCC have again been very supportive and provided us with core funding of £14,636 but it has been difficult to find other sources of core funding although at the end of the period the Allen Lane foundation provided us with £5,000 towards rent and utilities.

Our project manager Becky Duffy is continuing to do well and is assisting greatly in fundraising and raising the profile of the Charity, we have welcomed a number of new volunteers to assist Becky and the lads. We have not undertaken any fundraising activities during the period but plans were underway for the plant stall in May 2018. Becky, with the help of the Trustees and volunteers have attended a number of volunteer and other fayres during the period including the Faversham Hat Festival on the 31st March which has considerably raised the profile of the Charity.

During the period we have continued to look for a new vehicle for Sittingbourne. We were also able from grant funding to acquire further new equipment.

We thank our workforce for the ongoing success of FACE without their hard work in the homes and gardens of our clients we would not have such a successful charity, their work is very much appreciated. We continue to hear positive experiences from our clients which are also greatly appreciated by the Trustees and our project manager.

Financial Review

The accounts this year have been prepared on an accruals basis so as to reflect the true financial position of the Charity. The results are shown on page 5

Reserves Policy

The Trustees continue to look for new sources of income to build up their reserves, ideally to a minimum of six months expenditure

Plans for the Future

The Charity will search for new premises which will give us again a permanent base in the town, we will look for more volunteers and sources of core funding.

Risk management

During the period the Trustees have reviewed all major risks which the Charity could suffer and confirm all necessary action has been taken to mitigate.

We thank all those who have given their time and support over the period in helping us to achieve the aims of the Charity.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE PERIOD 1ST JULY 2017 TO 31ST MARCH 2018

1 Accounting policies

The Principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial are as follows:

a) Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities published on 16th July 2014, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015). Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note(s)

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis. There are no material uncertainties related to events or conditions which would cast doubt on the Charity's ability to continue as a going concern

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

b) Incoming resources

Income recognition policies

Items of income are recognised and included in the accounts when all the following criteria are met:

- the charity have entitlement to the funds;
- any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met or are fully within the control of the Charity.
- there is sufficient certainty that receipt of the income is considered probable; and
- the amount can be measured reliably

Incoming resources with related expenditure

When incoming resources have related expenditure the incoming resources and related expenditure are reported in the SOFA.

Donations

Donations are only included in the SOFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.

Tax reclaims on donations and gifts

Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the SOFA at the same time as the gift to which they relate.

Volunteer help

The value of voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the Trustees' Annual Report.

c) Resources expended

All resources expended are recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party. Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

d) Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

h) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.

Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure which meets this criteria is charged to the fund.
