TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2018

The Woodcote Charitable Association, a Company Limited by Guarantee, is registered with the Charity Commission (registered charity number 1080742) and constituted by a Deed of Trust, and with Companies House (registered company number 3986934) with Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 10th May 2000.

The Trustees have paid due regard to the activities which are for the public benefit and are as stated by the objectives of the charity which are to promote any charitable purposes for the benefit of the community in the Parish of Woodcote and the immediate surrounds thereof, and in particular the advancement of education, the furtherance of health and the relief of poverty, distress and sickness, and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation with the objective of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in notes to the accounts and comply with the charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011 and the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014.

The main fundraising event of the Association throughout the year was the staging of the 56th year of the Woodcote Rally on 13th, 14th and 15th July 2018. As the Rally weekend coincided with the hottest days of the summer of 2018, and the fact that the Rally is held on a largely open field, there was a much smaller public attendance than in the previous year, although the number of exhibits was larger than ever. As a result of the surplus of income over expenditure and a review of the general reserve fund, the Trustees decided to make available a charitable donation of £10,900 to local organisations, which meant that the total donated by the Woodcote Charitable Association since its inception came to £491,900. A list of the recipients and amounts can be found in the Notes to the Accounts.

During the year, the Trustees continued to manage the Woodcote Charitable Association through bi-monthly Trustee Meetings where, among other matters, the Trustees set a budget for the Woodcote Rally, monitor expenditure against budget, approve any single item of expenditure over £1,000, and ensure adequate health and safety plans are in place for the Woodcote Rally.

The Trustees wish to record their thanks to the members of the Rally Committee together with the team of volunteers for their dedication and enthusiasm in staging the 2018 Woodcote Rally.

TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2018 (cont)

After the 2017 Rally, the Trustees decided that the tasks and duties of the Rally Director were too time consuming for one volunteer and consequently created a new structure for the Rally Committee which devolves some of the Rally Director tasks to a Daytime Operations Manager and an Evening Operations Manager. Consequently, Mr John Green was appointed as Rally Director, and Mr Martin Allwright and Mr Jamie Bartholomew appointed as Daytime and Evening Operations Managers respectively. Mr John Green was also appointed as a Trustee of the Charitable Association by the Board of Trustees in March 2018.

At the 2018 Annual General Meeting of the Woodcote Charitable Association held on 25th April 2018, Mr Martin Maddock, Mr Bruce Jones, Mr Nicholas Bartholomew and Mr Geoffrey Capes retired from the board of Trustees by rotation and were all reelected as Trustees.

The date for the 57th Woodcote Rally has been set for 12th, 13th, and 14th July 2019.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF THE WOODCOTE CHARITABLE ASSOCIATION FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2018

I report on the accounts of the Trust for the year ended 31 December 2018, which are set out on pages 5 to 9.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The trustees (some of whom are also the directors of the company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed.
