Structure, governance and management

The charity is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation and is governed by the terms of its Constitution and Memorandum & Articles of Association.

The Charity was set up by a group of gymnasts' parents in 2015 to formalise the Parents Support Group whose role was to fundraise and support events held at the gymnastics club based at Segars Lane in Ainsdale. The Charity acquired the gymnastics business as a going concern and took over the ownership and management of the Gymnastics Club as of 1 September 2016.

Trustees are recruited, appointed and removed from office following the process as set out on the C.I.O. Constitution.

The Charity's Trustees work on a voluntary basis for no pay or remuneration.

The decision making process:

The trustees attend regular Committee Meetings, held as necessary, to determine and implement the strategic direction and policy of the Charity.

Achievements and performance

Over the past two years, we have embarked on an ambitious fundraising campaign to raise enough funds to enable The Charity to purchase the premises and secure the future of the club. We are very pleased to report that the Charity officially purchased the premises in November 2018, which is a fantastic achievement and we would like to thank everyone involved. This would not have happened without the tireless work and incredible support of our gymnasts, fundraisers, parent volunteers and all the staff. A special thank you needs to go to Manchester's Shoosmiths solicitors who have provided us with extensive legal advice and supported the club on a pro bono basis.

We have also been supported with grants for equipment from the Co-op Local Community Fund, Tesco, the West Lancashire Freemasons and The Ben Gautrey Foundation, which has allowed the club to focus its financial resources on the purchase of the building. With their support we have also been able to purchase new equipment for our gymnasts.

Fundraising this year has once again been exceptional and we are also extremely grateful for the continued support in our fundraising efforts from parents & family members, trustees, coaches, gymnasts and the local community. All have supported our many events, including a Charity Ball, sponsored bunny hops, pyjama week, cakes sales, fundraising parties, (Halloween being the highlight), quiz nights and a number of individuals have carried out personal challenges too. Barclays Bank has also generously matched the fundraising at a number of events and we are thankful to those individuals who have been involved in this process.

We also wish to thank the local businesses that have supported our annual Christmas Display event, donating gifts and prizes for the raffle and tombola.

This year we have recreated the Parent Support Group and we are very grateful for the help and support from all the volunteers. The group has been instrumental in organising fundraising events which have allowed us to purchase large pieces of equipment such as our new tumble track, which would not have happened without their support.

The Club remains the biggest provider of a single sport in the local region offering 1,300 young people access to an elite level facility and highly qualified coaches. A variety of classes are provided for all ages ranging from 6 months to 25 years for preschool, recreational, advanced and competitive levels of gymnastics and also competitive cheerleading.

This year, with the support of The Ben Gautrey Foundation, new day time classes were launched. The new "Mini Gym Star" classes are for children aged 6 months to 3 years and to date have been a great success and are proving extremely popular. The new tumbling classes that started early in the year are also now established and are providing children with a new and exciting class to attend.

Over the year the Club has been involved in many competitions and the success of the club has been overwhelming.

The girls' competition squad is going from strength to strength, seeing a host of medals and awards this year. At the start of the year all of the girls passed their club and national grades. Following that success they went to the North West Open, and the Club returned with three champions and the squad collected an astonishing thirty-three medals. The girls then went on to the North West Championships which saw one gymnast become a North West Champion, and a further twenty medals across the squad. One gymnast qualified for the National Challenge Cup and managed to bring home a gold medal on floor and a bronze medal on vault. The girls finished the year in style entering the Lancashire Red Rose Championships in their new club leotards. Five girls became

champions, and the wider squad collectively picked up an astonishing fifty medals.

The boys' competition squad have also had outstanding results this year seeing five gymnasts qualify for the National finals. One gymnast was part of a team who won a bronze medal and another won a team silver. One gymnast took third place at the North West National Development Plan Elite level 1 competition and another won at club level 2. A gymnast competing at club grade 6 won a silver medal and another at level 4 won a bronze. We have two international, world class gymnasts whose continued success is inspirational to all of our gymnasts, Dan Purvis and Frank Baines. They have both had an incredibly busy year competing. Earlier this year they both competed at the British Championships which placed Dan 3rd overall picking up a further two silver medals. Frank won gold on floor and silver on parallel bars.

Dan Purvis and Frank Baines both represented Scotland at the Commonwealth Games in Australia, where they managed to pick up a team bronze medal. Dan also claimed a floor bronze and Frank a bronze on parallel bars. Frank went on to represent Great Britain in Turkey at the World Cup bringing home 3 medals - a silver on floor, silver on parallel bars and a bronze on high bar. Frank was also part of the squad that went to the World Championships in Qatar, in early November.

The Cheerleaders have had a great year winning many new trophies and entering new divisions of competitions. A new team called Scorpion Fusion has been created and they placed 2nd in their first competition together.

The recreational classes have also performed very well this year achieving British Gymnastics Proficiency Award Badges at all levels, with many competing in the internal competition in July and impressing everyone at the annual Christmas display when the whole club comes together to show off their skills. This is the highlight of the year for all involved at the club.

The Charity is committed to safeguarding the welfare of all children and young persons and our aim is to ensure all who participate in gymnastics have a safe, fun, positive experience and are able to fulfil their potential. In order to help ensure a safe environment, we provide information and safeguarding training to enable those working with children in gymnastics to respond appropriately. We follow British Gymnastics guidelines and we have a designated Welfare Officer.

During the course of this year several of our assistant coaches have passed their level 1 & 2 coaching qualification. This involved many months of session planning and numerous training days to then have an assessment and we are hugely proud of all of them. All of the assistant coaches have also attended a British Gymnastics Award Scheme Coaching Course to develop their skills and understanding of coaching. Fifteen coaches have also completed a first aid course.

We have purchased a defibrillator which is now situated outside the building making it available to the local community.

A number of parents have qualified as club and regional judges, which is an outstanding achievement.

Financial review

During the period to 31st August 2018 the Charity has generated unrestricted funds totalling £99,399 and restricted funds totalling £47,586. The cumulative position with balances carried forward from the previous year totals unrestricted funds of £196,235 and restricted funds of £157,927, totalling £354,162 surplus funds available as at 31st August 2018.

The restricted funds represent grants and donations made for specific purposes and these have been for the purchase of the building, the purchase of gymnastics equipment, and also specifically for a Fast-track trampoline.

The restricted Building Fund reserves are allocated to purchase the existing premises at 55a Segars Lane, Ainsdale and as reported this actually took place after the year end, in November 2018. The trustees also set-aside unrestricted surplus funds from the charity's first year of operation for this purpose.

Funds were also raised specifically for a Fast track trampoline, which has now been purchased and installed, following the year-end, in September 2018 and all the gymnasts are now enjoying it.

We have expended most of the restricted funds that were donated last year to provide for bursaries. These funds have been used to subsidise fees for qualifying gymnasts, helping to ensure that the facility is available to all in the community. The trustees have elected to designate further funds for this purpose.

Unrestricted reserves are held to provide the Charity with sufficient cash flow as required by the club and will also be allocated for the purchase and maintenance of gymnastics equipment, particularly those items that are reaching the end of their usable life.

Plans for future periods

The Charity purchased the premises in November 2018 and has since renewed the heating and upgraded the lighting in the building. We are now planning on maintaining the building, replacing items that are in need of repair.

Future plans include the renewal of equipment, particularly those items that are reaching the end of their usable life. Fundraising efforts will continue to see new equipment purchases to ensure the club has the equipment required to enhance the performance of the gymnasts.

The Charity plans to work alongside British Gymnastics to see more talented young coaches pass their Level 1 coaching qualification and also provide the training to allow the progression to Level 2. We aim to promote and use the club's facilities as an approved training centre. This will ensure we are able to build a sustainable pipeline of quality coaches into the future.

The Charity plans to strengthen the Club's links with primary schools through increased provision during school hours, specifically targeting infant age children: Interschool competitions are planned.

The Charity would like to support the Club to compete in more competitions for all areas of the club, promoting its excellent facilities and coaching.

1. General information

The charity is a private company limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales and a registered charity in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is 55a Segars Lane, Ainsdale, Southport, Merseyside, PR8 3JA, England.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Disclosure exemptions

The entity satisfies the criteria of being a qualifying entity as defined in FRS 102. As such, No cash flow statement has been presented for the company.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. There are no material judgements, estimates or assumptions within these financial statements.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular future project or commitment.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

3. Accounting policies (continued)

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the
 contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual
 requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case
 it may be regarded as restricted.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.
- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking
 activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those
 support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable
 activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

Tangible assets

Tangible assets are initially recorded at cost, and subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Any tangible assets carried at revalued amounts are recorded at the fair value at the date of revaluation less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses.

Tangible assets (continued)

An increase in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of a revaluation, is recognised in other recognised gains and losses, unless it reverses a charge for impairment that has previously been recognised as expenditure within the statement of financial activities. A decrease in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of revaluation, is recognised in other recognised gains and losses, except to which it offsets any previous revaluation gain, in which case the loss is shown within other recognised gains and losses on the statement of financial activities.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Office fixtures, fittings and equipment

33% reducing balance

Gymnastics equipment

25% reducing balance

Freehold property

Installations only - straight line basis, over 15 years. (No depreciation is provided in this year for this class of asset since the installations were only installed, commissioned and operative just before the year end.)

Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or paable including any related transaction costs, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where it is recognised at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

Current assets and current liabilities are subsequently measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received and not discounted.

Debt instruments are subsequently measured at amortised cost.

20. Post balance sheet events

The charity completed the purchase of the property at 55a Segars Lane, Ainsdale in November 2018 for the sum of £350,000.
