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#### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

#### for the Year Ended 31 December 2018

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### **Objectives and aims**

To advance the Christian faith, and to relieve sickness and financial hardship and to promote and preserve good health by the provision of funds, goods or services of any kind.

#### Significant activities

During the year we established an official leadership team for the church and as at the end of the year there are two staff members, one full-time and the other part-time.

They are supported in the day-to-day 1 voluntary trainee who is part or our network's internship programme

Weekly worship meetings were held at Belle Vue social Club until August when we moved to St John's Green Primary School in Colchester due to growth.

Other church activities and programmes comprise mainly of the following:

- o Weekly prayer meetings
- o Weekly Small Groups where church members meet in small gatherings usually 8 16 in number. These meetings include, inter alia, worship, prayer and Bible study.
- o Children's work is undertaken primarily on Sunday mornings.
- o A "Pray and Play" meeting is held during the week for mothers and toddlers.
- o Various community events take place throughout the year, including lunches and our Christmas production
- o Volunteer workers undertake a formal teaching programme during their designated period to equip them for future roles and leadership either in the church or elsewhere
- o We have partnered with other local churches in serving the community, particularly through the large scale 'Colchester Family Fun Day.'
- o We hosted our network's Pioneer training weekend
- o Hugh Pearce and other members served churches in Helsinki and Sweden

As a result of the above activities the church has continued to thrive, with Sunday attendance growing. As a church we have been called to be an equipping and sending church, yet despite many members moving on during the year on missional activities the church continues to attract new members.

#### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### Charitable activities

2018 has been a year of rapid growth for Redeemer Church. We baptised people and are growing with in house financial giving. We have partnered with other local churches in serving the community, particularly through the large scale 'Colchester Family Fun Day.'

We hosted our network's Pioneer training weekend and Hugh Pearce and other members served at the Helsinki Church Plant.

Support is regularly given to those who are struggling in terms of practical efforts such as personal financial support by members in the church, transport, advice and counsel and temporary accommodation. We have begun communication with a community project that supports those who have left hospital and are in need of ongoing support whilst they settle at home - and so taking pressure of local services.

Our Small Groups multiplied into 4 groups and we aim to multiply further.

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a constitution, and is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO).

There are 4 current Trustees. The quorum is two charity trustees, or the number nearest to one third of the total number of charity trustees, whichever is greater, or such larger number as the charity trustees may decide from time to time. The Church operates in association with the Relational Mission Sphere of Newfrontiers.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the Year Ended 31 December 2018

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements and assessment of going concern

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

#### **Debtors**

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid.

#### Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash, current bank accounts and deposit bank accounts with no withdrawal limitations.

#### **Creditors**

Creditors are recognised where then charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors are recognised at their settlement amount.

#### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charity's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

#### **Financial instruments**

The charity only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially settled at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value.
