This year has been a year of consolidation of the work we do in supporting the vulnerable in the CPR area.

The appointment of a part time member of staff to operate our Step Up programme within the Community Hub has brought some remarkable results. In the first six months over 50 families were supported by this project and moved away from the need of the Foodbank Support. The work is complicated and emotionally difficult some times, but the Project Manager coped well with support from other members of the volunteering staff.

The Food Share project has been very busy collecting surplus food and delivering daily to other charitable activities. The volunteers have always been available to carry out this work and meet deadlines. The two fold approach of saving waste product and supporting other charities has had a significant effect on the area. We hope to expand this project in the near future.

The Easy It Training has been looking after those that want simple IT support to contact relatives etc. Every lesson has been over scribed and a great time of friendship had by meeting together.

It is great to report that Transformation CPR has received the Queens Award for Volunteering this year, also a volunteer has won the Cornwall volunteers award for outstanding work. It has just been announced that our Chairman has been awarded the MBE in the new years Honours list. These are great achievements but we are sure that all of those that work daily, do it because they care and not for awards.

We have been going through some difficult times with sickness and bereavement across the paid staff and volunteers. We are coping well but some delays have been caused in our admin, which we hope to catch up soon.

The Trustees are looking forward to supporting the many aspects of vulnerability across the area as they occur. We will be there to help people before they fall rather that pick them up at the bottom.
