STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Mothers' Union is an Anglican organisation which promotes the well-being of families worldwide. The charity is governed by a constitution approved on 3 November 2003 and updated on 10 July 2012. The Trustees control and manage the affairs of the charity in the Diocese.

Trustees are elected for a three year period initially and may stand for re-election for a further three years. In cases of unfilled positions, the existing board may appoint a suitable person to fill the role.

Reserves Policy

The charity has established a policy whereby the surplus funds not otherwise committed should be the equivalent of one year's expenditure. We consider that the equivalent of 12 months resources will give the charity sufficient funds to continue our current activities in the event of a significant reduction in funding

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The aim and objectives of the Mothers' Union is the advancement of Christian religion in the sphere of marriage and family life and to be specially concerned with all that strengthens and preserves marriage and Christian family life.

The Trustees have examined the major risks to which the charity is exposed and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the exposure to those major risks.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

In 2018 Mothers' Union - Diocese of York (MU York) had 1,400 members, almost all of whom belonged to semi autonomous branches centred on local parish churches. Branches met at regular intervals throughout the year for worship and fellowship, raised funds for the central Mothers' Union appeals, and supported their local churches and communities with activities like toddler groups. Another important branch activity was providing friendship and support to housebound and hospitalised members. Many members were involved with Prison work, looking after children in a safe and reassuring environment whilst a prison visit took place. Some members knitted garments and other items for refugees, premature babies and dementia patients and others distributed pocket crosses, for example at weddings and baptisms.

Branches were encouraged to take part in the 16 Days of Activism campaign to promote awareness of gender abuse, and in some areas they made up toilet packs and Christmas boxes for people seeking shelter in domestic refuges. Branches also came together for Corporate Communion services and Bible study, and joined in Deanery and Archdeaconry festivals.

MU York continued to run AFIA (Away From It All) caravan holidays in Filey. Branches were encouraged to sponsor families who otherwise would not have been able to afford a holiday. Two retreats were run for Mothers' Union Members at the Diocese of York's Retreat and Conference Centre at Wydale Hall near Pickering. We also sent out letters from the diocese and Mary Sumner House together with cards and prayers leaflets to Indoor Members.

In addition to the Diocesan Council Meetings, MU York ran a successful Sharing Day in the Autumn. This included presentations about projects being run in different parts of the diocese, offered ideas for running branch meetings and gave delegates an opportunity to ask questions and raise any concerns they had.

At the end of 2018 Mrs O Cooke came to the end of her second period in office as Diocesan President and Mrs H Castle was elected as President for the next three years. A presentation was made to Mrs Cooke at the November Diocesan Council to thank her for her work as DP.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The results for the year are as shown on pages 5 to 15 of these accounts.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

Much of the work of our branches is dictated by the needs of the parishes where they are located. However, MU York and the branches will actively encourage the wider community to take part in fundraising activities such as Make a Mother's Day, an alternative way of celebrating Mothering Sunday, and the Summer of Hope appeal.

Our Deanery committees will meet regularly to support branches, identify new ways of furthering our aims and objects, arrange special events and plan festivals.

At diocesan level, MU York will continue to run its programme of AFIA holidays in the forthcoming year. Two retreats are planned at Wydale Hall and we intend to hold another Sharing Day.

Conscious of our members who do not belong to branches, work will be undertaken to engage more consistently with our Diocesan Members. We will take steps to fill the vacancies on the Board and to identify people to assist with the work of the four units, i.e. Action and Outreach, Administration, Faith and Policy and Marketing. We also intend to investigate ways to improve our website and communications generally. Finally, following our 2018 changes to the Royal Charter of the Central Mothers' Union we plan to review our own constitution.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The charity is a public benefit entity and a registered charity in England and Wales and is unincorporated. The address of the principal office is 12 Sir John Hunt Cottages, Fulford Road, Fulford, York, YO10 4PG.

2. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities. The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

(b) Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

(c) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds comprise those funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objects of the charity. Restricted funds are funds which can only be used for a particular restricted purpose within the objects of the charity.

(d) Incoming resources

All income is included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity, it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.

(e) Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (continued)

3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Resources expended (continued)

- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

(f) Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably.

(g) Investments

Investments are a form of basic financial instrument and are initially recognised at their transaction value and subsequently measured at their fair value as at the balance sheet date using the closing quoted market price. The statement of financial activities includes the net gains and losses arising on revaluation and disposals throughout the year.

The main form of financial risk faced by the charity is that of volatility in equity markets and investment markets due to wider economic conditions, the attitudes of investors to investment risk, and changes in sentiment concerning equities and within particular sectors or sub sectors.

(h) Stocks

Stocks are measured at the lower of cost and estimated selling price less costs to complete and sell. Cost includes all costs of purchase, costs of conversion and other costs incurred in bringing the stock to its present location and condition.

3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(i) Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or payable including any related transaction costs, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where it is recognised at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

Current assets and current liabilities are subsequently measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received and not discounted.
