Chairman's Report

The Village Centre has grown enormously since it was built and extended. Demand has grown enormously and is likely to increase significantly over the next few years with development because this is the village's main community building. The Association is now a very successful but complex business operation taking up many hours of Trustees time.

The Trustees have identified a number of issues:

Difficulty of finding people to take on the role of Trustees with a significant concern that the Association is an unincorporated body thus increasing the risk of personal litigation.

Matters have become more complex due to our 1. Legal requirements, 2. Technical requirements such as Fire & Electric regulations 3. Health and Safety regulations. It has become increasingly clear that our Trustees do not have the necessary skills to manage these complex and vital areas.

The Trustees view is that the best outcome for the community was to approach the Parish Council to see if it would undertake to take over the running and management of the centre

The key reasons behind this decision were:

Most enquiries are now through the Parish Council as it is on site

It now runs the booking and billing service

It has professional staff well used to the necessary technical and legal requirements necessary for running a business of this sort.

It will be taking over the Hall in Court Bushes and there will be some economies of scale.

Furthermore, the Parish Council has recently and belatedly discovered that it has certain liabilities regarding the Village Centre lease, liabilities which are far more stringent than it had realised in its role as Custodian Trustee.

It is therefore because of all of the above reasons that following approval by the recent EGM that the Trustees have welcomed the Parish Council's acceptance to take over the Charity as Sole Trustee as soon as all the legal requirements have been met.

I report on the accounts of the Association for the year ended 31st March 2019

Respective responsibilities of the Executive Committee and the Examiner

The association's committee is responsible for the preparation of the accounts.
