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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2018

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 July 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Charity for Kids objectives are to promote and further the care and relief of children, who are still in full time education, who have a terminal illness or who are suffering from a life threatening medical condition and in particular by granting feasible wishes of such children.

To also relieve the needs of children with a severe disability or impairment or any disability that immobilises a child by providing such facilities, equipment and services that are over and above those which the local authorities provide.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Charity's aims and objectives.

Charity for Kids was set up by Paul Harris, Paul was stuck in a rut of drinking, smoking along with a poor diet, to get fit Paul entered the Hastings Half Marathon & decided to raise funds to make a difference to the lives of poorly children throughout the local community.

Volunteers

Charity for Kids continues to have 15 regular volunteers and actively encourage new members to join through fund raising events, our social media pages i.e. Facebook, Twitter and via our own website. We continue to encourage new members through our regular correspondence letters which go out to local businesses and supporters.

None of the volunteers or trustees receive a salary.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

In the past 12 months Charity for kids have helped 45 children. These included children with conditions such as Cerebral Palsy, Autism, Global development delay, Diabetes, Sensory processing disorder, and spinal muscular atrophy.

We support local special need school Glyne Gap so they were able to take the children away for a night on a school trip, thus providing a number of families with one night respite.

The charity has provided equipment such as specialist trikes to assist with muscle tone, sensory toys and equipment for autistic children, walking frames, specialist beds, sensory toys and anti-allergy bedding.

The charity has been lucky to have relationships with local businesses namely - Priory Meadow Shopping Centre and More FM, which has enabled us to support the local families at Christmas and Easter.

Charity for Kids continues to run a Respite Caravan at Crowhurst Park in East Sussex, and this is utilised, normally in school holidays to allow families to have a short break for free.

Fundraising activities

The committee arranges and takes part in a range of activities. We are also privileged to have a range of local people, companies, schools and community groups who arrange fundraising events that have served us well in the last twelve months. Examples of these events are:

Running races - London Marathon, Hastings Half Marathon, Brighton Marathon, as well as local 10k and 5k races Pier to Pier - Kayak challenge from Eastbourne to Hastings Piers Channel Swims Cycle rides to France Bewl Water Dragon Boat Race

We have also taken part in local events promoting what Charity for Kids do and providing a platform for local people to find out more about us.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

The principal source of funding for the year has come from donations and fundraising activities totalling £57,787.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2018

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
