For the year ended 31 December 2018

The Trustees have pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements for the Trust for the year ended 31 December 2018. The Trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT:

Governing Documents

The charitable Trust is governed by the governing document; a Trust Deed signed on 11 June 1992 and constitutes unincorporated charitable Trust of Ecclesiastical/ Canonical Charitable Trust.

Risk Management

The Charitable Trust's Trustees have a duty to identify and review the risk to which the Ecclesiastical/Canonical Charity of the Ethiopian Orthodox Tewahedo Church is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

The Trustees have set aside fund to cover core expenditure of the Trust in the event of unforeseen circumstances that will put the day to day operation at risk. The reserve represents a balance up to twelve months of core expenditures.

The Trust has an appropriate insurance coverage and maintenance plan for its Church and Vicarage buildings.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The Trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance 'public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'.

We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning our future activities.

- * Preaching the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ and providing spiritual services in accordance with the faith and order of the Ethiopian Orthodox Tewahedo Church of London & Home Counties under the jurisdiction of the Mother Church in Ethiopia
- * Providing pastoral counselling and encouragement to the community
- Teaching the young religious and ethical education
- Promoting understanding and harmony within the society in general
- Support humanitarian and disaster relief activities around the world

ACHIEVEMENTS ON THE LONG STANDING DISPUTE

The Trustees successfully prepared the new governing document; Charitable incorporated organization (CIO) and registered as of 15 November 2018. It has been agreed by all members and approved by the Court on February 2018.

On the 30 of April 2018 the court approved members of the 'Interim Trustees' for the purpose of new election based on the new CIO constitution. The First Trustees also known as 'The interim Trustees' of the charitable incorporated organization to which reference is made in the CIO shall be as follows;

Reverend Abate Gobena, Reverend Dawit Abebe, Reverend Berhanu Bisrat, Mr Fasil Bekele, Mrs Bethelhem Tadesse, Mr Mamo Lema, Mr Getachew Beshahwred and Mrs Aregash Gebrekidan.

PERFORMANCE

The Church has continued providing access to it services to all parishioners for a peaceful worship according to the Canonical law of the Ethiopian Orthodox Church and the Trustees have ensured the Church has delivered its objects proportionately and peacefully to the congregation during the year despite various challenges.

The Church invited Archbishop and Gospel preachers from the mother Church (the Holy Synod, Addis Ababa Ethiopia) to meet the spiritual demand of the parishioners, to promote peace, love and reconciliations among the parishioners and to review and deal with the on-going challenge facing the Church.

The Trustees are working closely with different expertise (Internal Audit, Property Custodian, Health & Safety and others) and maintaining regular monitoring and control over their work and setting benchmarks for performance review.

The Trustees are committed to ensuring regulatory compliances are met by filing accounts and returns within the statutory filing period and monitoring the operation of effective financial and operational controls.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The main source of income during the year was voluntary collection from weekly Church Service and religious events organised following Ecclesiastical Calendar. Resources expended during the year were spent wholly and exclusively on the provision of religious services and maintenance of its assets and property. The Trustees are committed to raising more funds in the years to come by organizing religious events and by setting targets for various stream of incoming resources.

There has been magnificent support from volunteers of the Church congregation in raising funds to help finance the on-going legal case.

The financial result for the year shows excess of income over expenditure compared to the previous year. This is due to the amount of legal cost expense decrease. The funds for the legal costs have been raised by dedicated volunteers committee with continuous effort and commitments in supporting the Trust until such time where the legal process is completely concluded in defending the Church. The Trustees have worked out and safeguarded the minimum annual funds required to keep the Church's operation on continual basis which is mainly raised from core charitable services.

VOLUNTARY SERVICES

As in the previous years the Trust has continued receiving voluntary services from various voluntaries on a range of areas and expertise which had paramount importance for the delivery of its services and achievements made during the year under Examination. The Trustees are very grateful for all the volunteers who have served the Trust and we believe the invaluable contribution of volunteers will continue in the years to come.

PLANS FOR THE COMING YEARS

Charitable Trust's Trustees have the following plans for the coming years:

- * To co-operate with the interim Trustees, implement the court order given in April 2018 and conduct new fair election with the time table given by the court.
- * To Transfer Asset of the charity to the new Governing document, CIO and cancel the old charity registration number and also the Trust Deed.
- * To work hard in bringing unity, reconciliation and maintain the continuity of unified congregation and service.
- * To continue delivering the Charitable objects of the Trust to the Congregation and ensuring the sustainability of the Trust by advancing the best interest of the Trust's objects and engaging with Congregations for service improvements.
- * To continue the improvement plan in place for transparent and timely Financial Reporting and effective control systems.

- * To increase the number of the Congregation and facilitate mechanisms in advancing the unity, harmony and peace within the parishioners by rectifying challenges and problems.
- * Maintain the Churchyard and refurbish the Church premises.

RESPONSIBLITEIS OF THE TRUSTEES

The Charitable Trust's Trustees are responsible for preparing the charitable Trust Trustees' Annual Report and Financial Statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (Charities SORP) and in line with the canonical laws of the Ethiopian Orthodox Tewahedo Church under the jurisdiction of the mother Church in Ethiopia.

The law applicable to Charitable Trust of Ecclesiastical/Canonical Charity in England and Wales requires the Charitable Trust Trustees' to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charitable Trust and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the Ecclesiastical/Canonical Charity for that period.

In preparing these financial statements the Charitable Trust's Trustees are required to: select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently; observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;

Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

Statements comply with the charities Act 2011 and the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008. The Charitable Trust Trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Ethiopian Orthodox Tewahedo Church Saint Mary London Debre Tsion, operating in the UK under the jurisdiction of the Mother Church in Ethiopia trusted to Ecclesiastical/Canonical Charitable Trustees and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities against the Charitable Trust.

1. Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, except for investments which are included at market value and the revaluation of certain fixed assets and in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), and the Charities Act 2011.

ETHIOPIAN ORTHODOX TEWAHDO CHURCH ST MARY OF DEBRE TSION LONDON meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note(s).

Going concern

The trustees of the Trust are satisfied that the Church is able to meet its obligations when they fall due through the normal donations and other receipts.

Statement of cash flows

The Trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in SORP FRS 102 from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charity is small.

Funds

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the Charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Donated services and facilities

These are sacred items donated by members of the Congregation for resale in furtherance of the Trust's objects.

Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as resources expended when there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the Charity to the expenditure:

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets, other than freehold land, are stated at cost or valuation less depreciation and any provision for impairment. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following basis:

Motor vehicles

20% Reducing balance

Fixtures and Fittings

20% Reducing balance

Stocks and work in progress

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items. Cost includes all direct costs and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.

Irrecoverable VAT

Irrecoverable VAT is included in the Statement of Financial Activities, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates
