Structure, Governance and Management

St. Christopher School Parents' Circle is a charity registered in England and Wales. It is an unincorporated association governed by a constitution, and is a member of ParentKind, the membership organisation for school parent associations.

Trustees are required to be parents of pupils at St. Christopher School, and appointments are agreed at the Annual General Meeting held in the Summer Term or at committee meetings. These are held twice a term, and all parents are welcome to attend. The Head and/or Deputy Head attend every meeting.

Objectives and Activities

The objects of St. Christopher School Parents' Circle are:

- To advance education in particular of the pupils attending St. Christopher School;
- To support other charitable purposes;
- To raise funds and receive contributions;

- To develop effective relationships between staff, parents and others associated with the school; and
- To engage in activities which support the school.

In relation to those purposes for the public benefit, many activities have been organised during the year, including the Fireworks Event, a Quiz Night, the Junior School Christmas Fayre, Mothers' and Fathers' Day Gift Stalls, the Summer Ball, and three Coffee Mornings. The Trustees would like to thank the Class Reps and all those within the school community who volunteered to help make these activities such a success. Without this help they would not have been able to achieve so much.

The Trustees declare that they have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

Achievements and Performance

At the beginning of the Autumn Term a welcome coffee morning was organised, as well as social evenings for families new to the school to welcome them in to the school community. This was followed in October by the Macmillan Coffee Morning which raised £207. In November the annual fireworks event with a professional display took place for families to enjoy, followed later that month by a Quiz Night, which was well attended. The Junior School Christmas Fayre, which included a wonderful Santa's Grotto, raised £2,260 which was donated equally to The Brain Tumour Charity and Water Aid. The term concluded with Christmas parties for all the pupils from the Early Years Centre up to Year 9.

The Spring Term started with a charity coffee morning which raised £85 for Dogs On The Street. A Mothers' Day Gift Stall was run in the Junior School, and on the last day of term the Easter activities included an Easter egg hunt for all the pupils from the Early Years Centre up to Year 6.

The Summer Term charity coffee morning raised £120 for Action for ME. A Fathers' Day Gift Stall was run in the Junior School, and ice creams were provided for all the pupils at the Junior School and Senior School Sports Days. The academic year ended with a very successful Summer Ball which raised an amazing £9,209 for The Sepsis Trust.

All these events have helped to build and maintain the sense of community within the school, and the funds that have been donated to charities have helped them to continue their work in the wider community.

In addition, throughout the year the Trustees have worked to promote the use of the Classlist secure online database within the parent community. This has proved to be very successful, and over 400 parents have now registered to use it.

Financial Review

Net income for the 12-month period to 31 July 2018 was £2,496. Total income was £27,957, and total expenditure was £25,461, and therefore 91% of income was contributed towards St. Christopher School and other charities. Funds carried forward at the end of the period totalled £8,715 (2016/17 £6,219).

The charity does not have a reserves policy, but the Trustees look to maintain enough money in the bank accounts to fund all forthcoming expenditure.

Notes to the accounts

Note 1 Basis of preparation

1.1 Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with:

the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2015, and with

the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), and with the Charities Act 2011.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

1.2 Going concern

There are no material uncertainties related to events or conditions that cast significant doubt on the charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

1.3 Accounting policies

The accounts present a true and fair view and the accounting policies adopted are those outlined in note 2.

1.4 Changes to accounting estimates

No changes to accounting estimates have occurred in the reporting period (3.46 FRS 102 SORP).

1.5 Material prior year errors

No material prior year error have been identified in the reporting period (3.47 FRS 102 SORP).

Note 2 Accounting policies

2.1 INCOME

Recognition of income

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when:

- the charity becomes entitled to the resources;
- it is more likely than not that the trustees will receive the resources; and
- · the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Offsetting

There has been no offsetting of assets and liabilities, or income and expenses, unless required or permitted by the FRS 102 SORP or FRS 102.

Donations

Donations are only included in the SoFA when the general income recognition criteria are met (5.10 to 5.12 FRS102 SORP).

Volunteer help

The value of any voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustees' annual report.

Income from membership subscriptions

Membership subscriptions received in the nature of a gift are recognised in Donations and Legacies.

2.2 EXPENDITURE AND LIABILITIES

Liability recognition

Liabilities are recognised where it is more likely than not that there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources and the amount of the obligation can be measured with reasonable certainty.

Deferred income

An item of deferred income has been included in the accounts. It is not material.

Creditors

The charity has creditors which are measured at settlement amounts less any trade discounts.

2.3 ASSETS

Debtors

Debtors are measured on initial recognition at settlement amount after any trade discounts or amount advanced by the charity. Subsequently, they are measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be received.
