Trustees' responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the report and accounts in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

The Charity's structure and details of how it is managed

The Learning Station Project offers English, Maths, IT and French classes to refugees, asylum seekers and migrants in London. It also organises cultural and sportive outings.

It relies strictly on volunteers. There are no employees and trustees are not remunerated.

Emmanuelle Yagour and Lola Siran, two out of the four trustees, are the cofounders of The Learning Station Project. They have volunteered with The Learning Station Project themselves for more than a year.

Laure Panerai regularly attends the classes and ensures a smooth functioning. She is also in touch with donors.

Alice Munnelly is a trusted and neutral person, who ensures efficiency.

Principal activities and objectives

The charity's principal objective was providing education and support and helping towards the integration of refugees and asylum seekers in London, in particular but not exclusively by:

- (i) Providing free English, IT, Maths and French classes
- (ii) Offering financial help for the travel costs
- (iii) Organising cultural and sportive outings

Achievements and performance

In the financial year cited above, The Learning Station Project has offered English classes every week on Mondays and Wednesdays, IT and French classes on Tuesdays and Maths classes on Thursdays.

It has organised cultural and sportive outings, such as visits in museums and football tournaments.

It has also collaborated with various organisations, such as TimePeace London and RefuAid.

It has supported and welcomed more than 100 students in total, coming from various countries, such as Sudan, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Syria, Iraq, Iran, and Afghanistan.

It has relied on the volunteering of 15 volunteers.

Financial review

The Learning Station Project was donated £2,000 in the financial year cited above.

In this financial year, £627 have been spent, exclusively to support the charity's beneficiaries.

There are no employees and volunteers as well as trustees do not get remunerated, nor compensated.

The Learning Station Project does not have any debt or reserves policy.

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
