Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

We have continued to provide our community with opportunity to learn in all age groups from Early Years to A-level.

Our after-school activities, such as drama, art, music and speech and language exercises have been very popular. This year we could also see great benefits of the sessions, as the children, who took part in them over last year became more confident, open to other children and staff, their communication skills vastly increased as well as their academic achievements.

We have been consulting our students' abilities with their mainstream schools to ensure that we can provide the best help in preparation for their GCSEs and A-levels. Our school has also been the first choice for those secondary schools, who are entering their students for GCSE Polish exams and would not be able provide a Polish examiner for the speaking component. Our students achieved brilliant results in their final exams and those results are included in their mainstream schools published results.

Being a part of the Polish Education Society in England, we are providing opportunities for our students to take part in various events.

During the academic year 2017-18 we provided opportunity for children who are not our students, to attend classes preparing them for sacrament of the First Holy Communion in Polish language. The classes were conducted by Polish Parish Priest from St. Michael Church in Birmingham.
