Projects Delivering Hope delivers tailor made aid to the South Sudanese in the form of short term projects which give long term benefit. Each project undertaken is carefully selected from a list of requests submitted to us by our beneficiaries and compared with our agreed project criteria.

In order to ensure accountability, the Trustees rely on the help and cooperation of their local partner, the Diocese of Kajo Keji, and its leader, the Rt. Rev. Emmanuel Murye who is the senior Bishop. He implements the various projects and provides evidence in the form of receipts and photographs that the project has been carried out. In addition, Trustees make annual visits to see progress for themselves and to meet with the local partner.

In co-operating with the Bishop, Projects Delivering Hope assists him in his objective of the advancement of religion within his diocese and the refugees for whom he has spiritual oversight.

One project was commenced and completed in the year 2018/2019 and this was the provision of Wellington boots for women farmers from the Mothers Union who had been working in flip flops and suffering from bites by ants and scorpions, and scratches from brambles.

In setting up these projects the trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

The trustees are pleased that in its first year since registration, the charity has raised sufficient funds to complete its first project, 'Women in

A great deal of work has also gone into the forthcoming 4 day business workshop when 7 experienced business people from the UK were recruited to travel to Morobi refugee camp in Uganda with the Trustees at their own expense in July 2019 to provide training for small businesses.

This will be followed by the setting up of community savings groups facilitated by a local person to be employed by the diocese. Projects Delivering Hope will provide the seed corn funding for the employment of the facilitator. For this work, the trustees are pleased to be partnering with microfinance charity, Five Talents who will train the facilitator and provide advice and guidance.

The Trustees were delighted to visit the beneficiaries of the charity in January 2019 when they travelled to the refugee camps in Uganda to see for themselves the positive impact that the projects were having. It also gave opportunity for the trustees to discuss future projects with the Bishop and members of his staff team.
