In Port Elizabeth the GRCT also funds The Missionvale Care Centre Programme for orphaned and vulnerable children as well as feeding programmes in the Missionvale school and other schools. One of the Trustees visits the projects at least once a year, and reports back to the other Trustees. The GRCT has set up a GRCT Project Association to monitor projects in Port Elizabeth and manage the funds for those projects. The GRCT funds the feeding of children in pre-schools in Hout Bay, Cape Town. The project is managed by the Hout Bay Rotary Club. The Hem of his Garment is supported with e'Pap feeding through Tigerkloof School.
