Chairman's report

An unremarkable year?

The past year was rather unremarkable but for two events.

Early on a weekend morning in May 2018 a small fire broke out on Holmbury Hill in an area which had recently been clear-felled. The fire alert was received after action by local bikers, who reported that they believed the fire had been successfully extinguished. However later that morning, on land adjacent to the original fire, brash left over from the recent felling had caught alight and the fire was spreading, fanned by a gentle easterly wind. The Fire Brigade and the Hurtwood Ranger attended and by late afternoon the fire was under control having spread over some 10 acres. This incident caused us to review our fire risk assessment and with temperatures gradually increasing through the summer the whole of the Hurtwood was put under a fire risk alert from July. Although fortunately an isolated incident, it emphasises the risk from fire, especially in exceptionally dry periods and where there is brash left after felling operations.

The second event provided significantly more positive news. We were approached by the Land Trust who asked us if we would be interested in managing Bookhurst Wood in Cranleigh on their behalf. This lovely 15 hectare ancient semi-natural woodland has large areas of old hazel and hornbeam coppice with mature oak standards, birch, ash willow and aspen that provide interest throughout the year. The bluebells in spring are a particular highlight. We naturally agreed and in return for a small management fee we are now the designated access manager. In addition, improvement works specified and paid for by the Land Trust will be project managed by our Ranger.

Finance

The detailed financial accounts for the year are included later in this annual report. Here I will focus on the main sources of income:

- Individual members total just under 400, in addition 15 or so local organisations and businesses regularly support our charity
- Almost 40% of individual members have been with us for more than 10 years
- In the last year we gained 41 new members but regrettably lost almost twice that number.

The shrinkage in membership is concerning and a number of actions are being put in place to address this. We are seeking an individual to assume responsibility for membership development; during the summer we have planned recruitment campaigns in our car parks and with our extended presence at Bookhurst Wood we hope to encourage a greater membership in Cranleigh.

Reserves

During the year, as planned, £175,000 was invested in a portfolio managed by Octopus Investments on behalf of the Charities Aid Foundation. The balance of our reserves are in interest bearing Income Bonds at NS&I and, in our current accounts at Unity Trust Bank plc.

The Trustees are confident that the reserves are adequate for a charity of our size.

Risk

The Risk Register is updated regularly to take account of the changing nature of the environment of the Hurtwood (e.g. trail erosion, forestry works), the potential for conflict between different users (e.g. fast moving bikers and horse riders), financial risk and various other issues (e.g. fly tipping and fire risks).

The Trustees have reviewed the updated risk register and are satisfied that appropriate and proportionate action is in place to mitigate the risks identified.

I should also record thanks to all those who, by volunteering to help at working groups, village shows and events during the year and by spreading the word about our work, ensure that The Friends of the Hurtwood remains visible in the local community.

Finally, I would like to pay a special tribute to David Lees, who resigned at the end of the year to concentrate on developing his architectural practice. As a trustee and latterly a director, David made a significant contribution to our management strategy for biking on the Hurtwood, the substance of which was latterly adopted by the AONB for use in the Surrey Hills.

Operations Report

Fly tipping continues to increase on the Hurtwood, asbestos continues to be dumped, though slightly less this year. As you can imagine, this continues to be a considerable cost which we have to bear for providing car parking for visitors to the Hurtwood. We have looked at cameras, but have been told that this will not deter criminals who most likely will be using false number plates or un-registered vehicles.

On Pitch Hill we have re-instated a long-lost footpath from Moon Hall Road to the summit of the Hill. This was a joint effort between ourselves and Surrey CC Rights of Way department. Though it's not the most popular of routes it was important as it avoided a nearby bike trail that was causing confusion for walkers looking for the original footpath. We have also erected new barriers to keep cyclists and horse riders away from the Greensand Way footpath that skirts around the Eastern side of the summit. We have erected new "Share with care" signage in Pitch Hill and Walking Bottom car parks.

Work on cutting back the young tree growth from the main rides on Holmbury Hill has mostly been completed but will continue on some smaller rides. The fire road leading up to the reservoir from Mackies Hill that was damaged by the logging operations has now been re-instated by Shere Manor Estate. We have regraded the surface to the main Holmbury Hill car park, No.1.

In Summary during the year 2017/18 we have:

- Removed approx. 14 tons of fly tip from the car parks
- Repaired main tracks and fire roads
- Erected new signage
- Cleared over 6 miles of paths
- Cleared fallen trees obstructing paths
- Regularly cut back grassy areas
- Cut back extensive gorse re-growth from fire roads
- Given talks about the Hurtwood to various organisations, including local schools

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant notes to the accounts.

These accounts have been prepared in accordance with:

the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) isued on 16 July 2014

and with the Financial Reporting Stanadard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102 1A) and with the Charities Act 2011.

Change of accounting policy

The accounts present a true and fair view and the accounting policies are those outlined in this note.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Changes to accouting estimates

No changes to accounting estimates have occurred in the reporting period.

Material prior year errors

No material prior year errors have been identified in the reporting period.

Funds

Unrestricted funds represent the funds of Friends of the Hurtwood that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and are available for the general purpose of the trust. Funds designated by the Trustees for a particular purpose are also unrestricted.

Restricted funds consist of monies received for specific purposes. The unspent balances of the funds may not be used for any other purposes unless the Trustees have received, from the donors, express permission to do so.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds where the Trustees have resolved to set aside the funds for a specific purpose.

Designated Legacies Reserve is an unrestricted reserve that the trustees have set aside to fund projects that will enhance the efficiency of the Charity.

Recognition of income

Income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity becomes entitled to the resource, it is more likely than not that the trustees will recive the resource and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Depreciation

Depreciation is charged at the following rates:

Tractor - 10% per annum straight line
Pick-up Truck - 20% per annum reducing balance.
Signs and notice boards - 14 1/3% per annum straight line
Other equipment - 20% per annum reducing balance.
Computers and other IT equipment - 33 1/3% per annum straight line

- 1. Name: Friends of the Hurtwood
- 2. <u>Constitution</u>: The Trust is an unincorporated association registered as a Charity The objects are contained in the Constitution adopted on 6th December 2000 and varied since that date. Copies will be available at the Annual Meeting if any Friends wish to see one.
- 3. Number: The registered Charity Number is 200053.
- 4. <u>Members of the Trust</u>: Membership is open to any person over the age of 18 who supports the objects of the Charity and subscribes or makes donations to the Charity on a regular basis or who otherwise applies to become a Member of the Charity.
- 5. <u>Address</u>: The address of the Charity and the name of the Secretary and Ranger appear on the back of the Annual Report.
- 6. Bankers: Unity Trust Bank PLC, Nine Brindleyplace, Birmingham, B1 2BR
- 7. There are no restrictions on the way in which the Trust operates nor are there any specific investment powers.
- 8. The Trust's objects, which are set out in the Constitution, are to administer the public rights of access to land on the Hurtwood placed by landowners within the Trust's control. The policies adopted by the Trust to further the objects are explained in the reports from the Chairman and Ranger.
- 9. Trustee and management: The sole Trustee is FOTH Trustee Company Limited. The names of its Directors appear on page 13. The Articles of Association of the trustee company provide for a maximum of 18 Directors, comprising 4 Landowner Representative Directors and 14 Independent Directors. The affairs of the Trust are controlled by the Trustee, whose Board meets at least twice a year. During the year the executive authority rested with the Chairman's Management Committee. The Comittee supervised the activities of the Secretary/Ranger, which is a full time executive post.
