Report of the Trustees

for the Year Ended 31 August 2018

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 August 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The purpose of the school fund, as set out in its rules, is to provide enhancement activities for the students of West Kirby grammar school and support for parents in financial need. The fund receives donations from parents, pupils, staff and the local community. The fund makes donations to chosen charitie. It also enhances the education of students through development of the School's grounds and improving the school's resources.

The principal activity is to provide enhancement opportunities which will challenge, support and motivate students. In setting the school funds objectives and planning its activities, trustees have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit.

Significant activities

Students are given the opportunity to participate in many different visits each year. These are mainly organised by departments and range from numerous local trips and visits, which enhance the curriculum, to up to fifteen foreign visits each year to Europe, America and China.

Examples of recent trips include language visits to France, Germany, Spain and Italy, science visits to CERN, a geography expedition to Iceland and Religious Studies and History visits to Auschwitz and the First World War battlefields.

Expeditions to China take place on an annual or biennial basis, working with children in Inner Mongolia, as well as visiting Hong Kong and Beijing.

We also have a very successful Comenius partnership, which has been in existence since 2004. Our group of five schools has worked together on two large projects, the more recent of which can be viewed on the school website. This has allowed many students to take part in conferences in Poland, Finland, Germany and Hungary over the past two years; staying with families and experiencing life in different cultures from our own.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 August 2018

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
