### 1. STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

### Governing document and constitution

SYCT is constituted as a company limited by guarantee and registered as a charity with the Charity Commission. SYCT's governing documents are its Memorandum and Articles of Association. SYCT has 8 Directors/Trustees and 5 full employees, 2 apprentices and a further 15 part-time employees (11 full time equivalent).

### Appointment and role of Trustees

SYCT has a board of 8 trustees. The board meets four times a year and more often to work on subgroups or deal with matters arising requiring board involvement. Vacancies on the Trustees' board are advertised on our own website and social media platforms as well as on our notice boards in our buildings. Applications can only be made following our safer recruitment practices.

SYCT's Trustees provide strategic leadership, determine the policies of the charity and employ staff to carry out its charitable purposes. The Trustees are responsible for ensuring that the incoming resources are expended to further the objectives of the charity.

### Management

The Trustees appoint a chief executive officer (CEO) who manages the operation of the charity and reports to the Trustees at the regular Trustee meetings.

The CEO holds regular management team meetings with key staff and regular full staff meetings.

### Co-production

Our services are co-produced with everyone who has a stake in them. This includes young people, disabled people, staff and volunteers. This is a core value of SYCT and helps to ensure services reflect the needs and aspirations of the people for whom we are working.

#### **Related Parties**

SYCT is committed to working in partnership with other organisations who share our aims and aspirations.

This year SYCT has led on the creation of the Streatham Youth Partnership, bringing together eight partner organisations who work with children and young people in Streatham. The partnership has developed a shared vision and mission statement and works together to avoid duplication, identify gaps in services and improve referral processes.

We have also been instrumental in the creation and success of the Streatham Early Help Partnership which brings together a range of agencies including schools, health, social workers and youth workers to work together to deliver better interventions and outcomes for children and families.

#### SYCT has close links with:

Young Lambeth Coop (YLC) who commission services for children and young people and lead on initiatives to support the sector.

**London Youth** We are a Silver Accredited member of London Youth and working towards Gold. London Youth provide training and conferences relating to the needs of young people. This facilitates partnerships and creates a culture where projects can grow.

**LB Lambeth** who own some of the assets where our services are delivered and are a key partner in enabling the provision of services for children and young people.

### **Risk Management**

The Trustees regularly review the charity's exposure to risk. SYCT have adopted 'Assured Quality for Youth Projects' (AQYP) procedures approved by London Youth and the Jack Petchey Foundation. The charity is accredited by City and Guilds to SILVER standard and working towards the Gold award.

These procedures incorporate all aspects and legal requirements about safeguarding. SYCT remains fully compliant in this area.

We have remained up to date with changes in law and legislation which could pose a risk to SYCT including auto enrolment and GDPR.

#### **Public Benefit**

The Trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and are satisfied that the objectives and activities of SYCT conform to this guidance in its provision of services to all members of the community.

The overall aim of our services is to improve the lives of children and young people and support them to meet their full potential.

### 3. PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

We have ambitious plans for SYCT.

In October 2018 we opened a FOREST SCHOOL NURSERY. The nursery offers up to 20 places for children aged 2-4. Priority goes to local families looking for high quality, part time nursery provision and parents can use their government funding to pay for the childcare.

We are exploring the development of our assets and considering a proposal presented to us by Marshall Eaton to rebuild our property assets to create first class facilities for young people combined with some housing to be sold on the open market.

The outcomes we hope to achieve through realising our plans are:

- To ensure the sustainability of our high-quality services for future generations of children and young people.
- To develop and deliver new services meeting emerging and evidenced gaps in services and meeting the needs of children and young people
- . To ensure that children and young people have access to high quality facilities

### 4. FUNDRAISING

The charity employs a full time and experienced fundraiser to lead on bid writing, commissioning and fundraising activities. We are proud of our track record to win bids to deliver services. We have a diverse income stream and have a strategy to generate more of our own income in the future, becoming less reliant on grant funding.

In a bid to diversify our income streams further, the Board approved the proposal presented by our fundraiser to open a charity shop in neighbouring Balham. Following a full cost/benefit analyses the shop opened its doors in May 2018. The shop has operated as a charity shop in the past, however became available following the end of the lease with the previous lease holder. The charity employed an experienced and well connected person to manage the shop and has a team of seven volunteers. As well as bringing in an extra source of income it also provides a great opportunity to promote the work of SYCT further

### 5. FINANCIAL REVIEW

### Review of the charity's financial performance and position

We are pleased to report a close to breakeven outcome for the year (SOFA deficit £11,636).

#### **INCOME**

Income for the year was £464,627 of which £220,593 was restricted and £244,034 was unrestricted.

### BALANCE SHEET

The balance sheet reflects a decrease in net assets equivalent to the reported deficit. Net assets at 30<sup>th</sup> September 2018 amounted to £1,138,840 of which £877,134 is represented by the value of fixed assets, nearly all of which is operational land and buildings.

### 6. FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT STRATEGY

Although commissioning and grant funding will always be an important source of funding to enable us to deliver vital services for children and young people, we understand that the funding climate is changing, and this funding is getting more difficult to secure. Therefore, our strategy is to become less reliant on external funding through commissioning and grants and to generate more of our own income through improving and expanding our assets and seeking new ways to attract unrestricted income. With new or improved facilities, we will be better equipped to do this and generate increased income through hiring's and other income generating activities.

We operate the charity on extremely limited staff resources in terms of back office functions allowing as much income as possible to flow to direct delivery of services and continually strive to seek value for money with our service contracts

### 7. RESERVES POLICY

SYCT policy is to aim to hold free reserves equal to 4 months' forward expenditure. This implies free reserves of £159,000, against which the measure of free reserves at 30th September 2018 was £261,705 (being accumulated funds less tangible fixed assets for charitable use).

### 8. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Annual General Meeting at which this report and financial statements will be presented will take place at The John Corfield Centre, Conyers Road, Streatham, SW16 6LS on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> July 2019 and will be followed by the presentation of achievement awards to members.

### 9. INDEPENDENT EXAMINER

SYCT opted to have an independent examination of its Accounts as the organisation qualifies as audit exempt. SYCT appointed Mr M L Martin FCA of Lloyd & Co Chartered Accountants, as independent examiner.

### Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees

### Year ended 30th September 2018

I report to the charity Trustees on my examination of the accounts of Streatham Youth and Community Trust (SYCT) for the Year ended 30th September 2018, which are set out on pages 8 to 16.

### 1 Accounting policies

### (a) Basis of preparation

SYCT is a public benefit entity within the meaning of FRS102.

The financial statements are prepared under The Charities Act 2011 and incorporate the requirements of Statement of Recommended Practice SORP (FRS102).

The financial statements have been prepared in order to give a 'true and fair view' and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair view'. This departure has involved applying Statement of Recommended Practice SORP (FRS102) rather than SORP 2005 which has been withdrawn.

The financial statements are prepared on the accruals basis applying the historical cost convention.

The financial statements include all transactions, assets and liabilities for which SYCT is responsible in law.

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

### (b) Income

Income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities to the extent that such resources have been received or are otherwise due at the year end. Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations, bequests, fund raising activities and investment income. Donated services and facilities are included at a best estimate of their value.

### (c) Expenditure

Expenditure is included in the Statement of Financial Activities based upon the date it is incurred. Fund raising activities comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income including the costs of running functions and events. Direct charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred in the delivery of activities and services. Elements of cost which are the subject of restricted funding are identified and shown as restricted expenditure.

### (d) Fund accounting

- (i) Endowment funds arise where incoming resources have a specified purpose and are in the nature of capital sums from which only the income arising can be spent (according to the purposes specified by the donors, if any, or otherwise at the Trustees' discretion).
- (ii) Restricted funds arise where incoming resources have a specified purpose; related expenditure is allocated against such income.
- (iii) Restricted income which relates to fixed assets expenditure is transferred to unrestricted funds following its utilisation to the extent that such expenditure relates to the furtherance of direct charitable (unrestricted) activities.
- (iv) Unrestricted funds arise where there is no specified purpose and may accordingly be utilised at the Trustees' discretion.
- (v) Accumulated funds represent aggregate retained amounts, and comprise balances on endowment, restricted and unrestricted funds.

### 1 Accounting policies (continued)

### (e) Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided so as to write off the cost of fixed assets, less any residual value, over their estimated useful lives, applying policies as follows:-

### (f) Operating leases

Costs of operating leases are included in the Statement of Financial Activities as incurred.

### (g) Taxation

SYCT has full charitable status and has no activities which would be liable to either income or corporation tax. All its income is applied for charitable purposes. Income tax is recoverable on gift aid donations and is accounted for as it becomes receivable.
