TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT AND ACCOUNTS - Year Ended August 31st 2018

Accountants: King Hope Chartered Accountants, 31 Victoria Road, Darlington

Public benefit:

Elm Ridge Methodist Church provides a seven day a week Christian ministry to the West Darlington neighbourhood. Regular services of worship are at the heart of our mission, and supported by prayer meetings, some Home Fellowship groups and pastoral care to members and adherents.

The premises are used extensively for a wide range of activities for all ages and are open to the whole community. The premises are also used by external organisations such as Slimming World, Weight Watchers, the local PACT group, Probus, an Art Group, Embroiderers Guild, the Richardson Singers, Parklnsons UK, a local baby massage group and aerobics group. We welcome any organisation provided they do not detract from the Christian ethos of the church. A weekly Coffee Drop-in session and a fortnightly Craft and Chatter group are open to the public and help build relationships with our local community.

The Trustees believe they have had due regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit.

Activities

Our "Tiddlywinks" group which meet on Monday afternoon from 1.30-3pm continued throughout the year. This group provides a play and education facility for pre-school children and social interaction for parents, carers and children - both indoors and outdoors in our extensive and carefully maintained grounds. We contribute to the local food bank on a regular basis.

A full range of uniformed groups - Rainbows, Beavers, Brownies, Cubs, Guides and Scouts – for children and young people aged 5-16 - meet on most weekday evenings, and we encourage social events involving families. Most of the uniformed groups have a waiting list.

Elm Ridge Church supports retired/elderly people by providing several groups for friendship, support, fellowship and instruction which meet weekly, fortnightly or monthly. A monthly lunch club, held in conjunction with Age UK, where all are welcome provides another opportunity to meet together. In addition there are home study groups (or House Groups) for all members of the Church. A pastoral care team supports everyone in the church family and visits vulnerable elderly people in their homes around the neighbourhood, including some in residential care homes. We also have a Prayer Trail around the gardens for use as desired by the Community.

Our Sunday services are held at 10am and 6pm, and we hold Parade Services for the children belonging to the uniformed organisations to be present on appropriate Sundays of the year. We have joint services with All Saints Parish church once or twice a year alternately at each church.

Structures:

Elm Ridge Church is part of Darlington Methodist Circuit, which includes 9 Methodist churches in the Darlington area. It is governed by a Church Council (membership listed) meeting at least three times per year plus an AGM at which all 154 (October figure) church members are eligible to attend. Representatives of the Church Council attend the Circuit Meeting which convenes at least three times a year.

Detailed work on property and finance is carried out by the relevant committees which report to the Church Council. The leadership of the Church is through the monthly Stewards' Meeting which reports directly to the Church Council.

This is the established pattern set out in the Constitutional Practice and Discipline of the Methodist Church 2010/2011, approved by the annual Methodist Conference, under the Deed of Union, 1932.

Performance I achievements over the last year:

Rev Andrew Stobart continued as the sole Presbyter of Elm Ridge Methodist Church and Superintendent of the Darlington Circuit. He was assisted on a daily basis by the Supernumerary Presbyters, Rev. Selby White and Rev. John Bower. The Church Administrator is a focal point of contact for all enquiries and administrative matters.

Centralised worship with the other churches in the Darlington Methodist Circuit continued on a regular basis, partly to help alleviate the shortage of preachers. 'Together at Bondgate' services were held on the first Sunday of each month offering different styles of worship. 6 pm evening services throughout the Circuit were held on rotation at Elm Ridge, Cockerton, Harrowgate Hill and Bondgate Methodist Churches.

During the week various groups meet regularly for Bible study, fellowship and prayer. The Church Prayer Group, which has met for many years, continued to do so each Tuesday morning to pray for the Church family, the wider community and national and international issues. The Worship Group of musicians and singers often lead our services. All of our Church services are open to any member of the public.

A full programme of activities means that the recruitment and training of new volunteers, including their DBS clearance and safe-guarding training, is vital and on-going. Most groups have regular review and planning meetings to adjust goals and evaluate performance in order to achieve best practice.

Our Harvest Festival services and associated social events were very well attended and money was raised for the Methodist Relief and Development charlty 'All We Can'. Christmas events included a Service of Lessons and Carols, Christmas Eve Communion and a Christingle service, all of which were very well attended. The retiring collections from the Christmas services were donated to Action for Children. Special celebration weekends and other events were also held; the proceeds from which were donated to Methodist Homes, Mission Aviation Fellowship, Cardiac Risk to the Young and Breast Cancer Care.

Women's Fellowship and Men's Fellowship continued to meet. The Table Tennis Group meet on Friday evenings and the Banner Group met to produce new work.

Our annual Garden Party was held in June. This is a major community event, attracting many people from the local community. The proceeds were such that we were able to make a gift of £500 to the Methodist Church Relief and Development Charity 'All We Can'.

Aims and objectives for the coming year:

- 1. To provide varied, relevant and inclusive worship.
- 2. To lead people to faith in Christ and nurture and encourage them.
- 3. For us all to become more effective disciples of Christ.
- 4. To continue to give active support to the wider Methodist Circuit, especially in terms of offering whole-hearted support to working with the other churches to deepen our faith and knowledge of Christianity, taking an active interest in the mission of the Darlington Methodist District and the wider Methodist Connexion.
- 5. To explore opportunities for ecumenical relationships in the context of the Anglican/Methodist Covenant and other initiatives, including supporting 'Churches Together in Darlington'.
- 6. To support voluntary and charitable work around the UK and beyond.
- 7. To continue our programme to identify and train new leaders for several groups, including workers with children and young people.
- 8. To ensure that our pastoral care is as effective as possible.
- To seek appropriate ways to include our local community in the life of the Church and for the Church to build mutually beneficial relationships with the people with whom we come into contact.
- 10. To look at options for the sustainable future of Elm Ridge Church centred on a balanced budget and maximising the use of the buildings and grounds.

Safeguarding Policy:

The Safeguarding Policy is made known to all group leaders, helpers and user groups. It is displayed on the notice boards and kept up to date by our Safeguarding Officers, who visit each group working with children and vulnerable adults to explain procedures and answer questions. Safeguarding training has been offered during the year and plans are in hand to keep this updated and to appraise new helpers. The list of DBS checked helpers is kept constantly updated. In addition Safeguarding posters are displayed on notice boards.

Risk Assessment and Health & Safety:

Risk assessments have continued throughout the year and remedial works have been undertaken. On-going maintenance is carried out on a weekly basis, further tree surgery has been undertaken and digital lock codes have been altered. An integrated smoke alarm system is installed in the church building. Our reserves policy earmarks a reserve of £50,000 to cover "worst case scenario works" associated with asbestos, tree surgery and the septic tank.

Documents regarding the financial risk of Trusteeship are made available to new Trustees when appointed.

Our Property Committee and Finance Committee regularly review the risks connected to their areas of work and report to the Church Council appropriately.

Financial Review for the 12 months ending August 2018:

The Church recorded an operating surplus of £3,957 for the year, including a legacy of £16,929. Together with delayed Gift Aid tax refund the underlying deficit fell to £110,064.

The Reserves and Investment Policies were revised accordingly and presented to Trustees.

The church's investments (other than cash) are held with the Trustees for Methodist Church purposes.

The accounts are included with this Report.
