STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is constituted by a Trust Deed dated 13th January 1995 which is its governing document.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

New trustees are invited to become trustees by the existing trustees on their basis of their commitment to the Christian faith and their commitment to promoting the Christian faith by supporting the ministry of Nick and Lois Cuthbert. The new trustees are appointed by the existing trustees and are informed about their responsibilities by being referred to suitable Charity Commission information.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 5TH APRIL 2019

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objects of the Charity are to advance the Christian religion and to pursue such other charitable purposes as the Trustees shall from time to time think fit. The Charity advances the Christian religion by facilitating the ministry of Nick and Lois Cuthbert. Nick is an Honorary Lay Canon Emeritus of Birmingham Cathedral. The Trustees have the responsibility of cooperating with Nick and Lois in the advancement of the Christian faith and supporting the activities in prayer.

The Trustees and Nick and Lois are committed to assisting Churches and Christians in their ministry and enabling as many people as possible to have the privilege of knowing Jesus Christ as their Lord and Saviour.

When planning activities with Nick and Lois the Trustees have considered the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit.

In particular we try to advance the Christian faith and provide public benefit by:-

- supporting and releasing Nick in his involvement with Lead Academy, a registered charity of which he is a trustee and for whom he ministers with others in the leadership and support of learning communities. Lead Academy promotes the Christian faith by supporting and coaching learning communities of churches in reviewing and developing their vision and sharing their faith and serving their community more effectively
- encouraging and facilitating evangelism and the practice of their faith by Christians by encouraging and training leaders, mentoring and coaching Church leaders and other Christians, including in positions of responsibility inside and outside the Church.
- consultations with churches to support them in their ministry.
- evangelism.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

During the course of the period covered by these accounts activities undertaken by Nick and Lois included:

- continued involvement with Lead Academy, a charity focused on providing insights and tools to release churches to their full potential by working together with church leadership teams in the context of learning communities. Ten communities of leadership teams were running this year. Activities for each learning community include four two-day training days for each of the communities over a 2 years period plus retreats, as well as church visits, and consultancy for the churches involved. Over the 12 months covered by the accounts communities ran with Anglican, Baptist, Free Methodist, independent and Holy Trinity Brompton Church plant and resourcing churches plus communities of churches gathered from different denominations and settings; in London, Scotland, Ireland, Chester and market towns. Feedback on the work of Lead Academy includes "The Lead Academy programme is excellent and the time spent away with other senior leaders from our church has already proved helpful. It was particularly useful to work through the Lead Academy training as a team. It enabled us to discuss the issues we face, make plans and pray together. I'd thoroughly recommend Lead Academy!" Nick's role with Lead Academy has evolved. As a pioneer and trustee he jointly ran many communities for many years. His role now extends to providing materials, training other leaders and consultancy and to an ambassadorial, pioneering role with potential new communities. All this facilitates expansion of the work. The impact is such that discussions are now ongoing with the Chelmsford, Gloucester, Lichfield, Nottingham, Oxford, Portsmouth, Sheffield, York and Birmingham Dioceses, all of which are potentially new training opportunities. Nick attends at least one meeting of each learning community.
- Consultation for a number of individual churches and training, mentoring and coaching Church leaders and other Christians.
- Training days, weekends for churches and church leaders from a variety of denominations including URC.
- Speaking at services.

The work includes consultancy on the stresses of leadership, dealing with relationships, effective governance, flourishing leaders and flourishing teams, all to facilitate Church mission, service and growth, as well as providing counselling to a number of Church leaders and other Christians. The activities Cana facilitates provide public benefit as they assist Churches and Christian leaders in developing their ministry, serving their local communities and in seeking to reach as many people as possible with the good news of Jesus Christ without discrimination of any kind.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Charities Act 2011 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Motor vehicles - 20% on reducing balance

Computer equipment - 33% on cost

Assets are depreciated from the date that they are brought into use.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
