The events that we have attended have also been opportunities to educate the public about animal welfare, the need to challenge animal cruelty, and how animals are best cared for.

Animal Canopy promotes animal welfare in the main by making grants to appropriate organisations who have met the grant making policy requirements. Each organisation has followed the application process prior to the grant being released, and has then executed the project/activities which provided the basis for the grant being made.

Animal Canopy is very appreciative of the contributions made by our valued supporters. They have been very supportive and have offered their time, expertise and suggestions unstintingly.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Achievements and performance

Achievements in 2018.

Our activities in 2018 have focused on fund raising and allocation of grants to qualifying organisations.

Our fund raising activities have included street and shop collections, attendance at school and local community fairs/carnivals/fetes/craft fairs etc, table top sales, and a number of financial donations. It has been encouraging to receive some donations on a regular basis. We have also been well supported by the donation of items for our events (including individually crafted items, unwanted presents and other items which supporters have wanted to give). During the year we have attended 41 events. They have all been based in Dorset and Hampshire. This is a less than last year, due mainly to cancellations because of poor weather and ill health.

We have transferred the support of the dogs of the homeless people of Bournemouth to 2 other local organisations who are well placed to continue with this valuable animal welfare work. We would like to take this opportunity to thank the staff of Natterjack's of Bournemouth who gave us substantial and willing veterinary support for our work in this area.

A total of £16,040 was raised in 2018, which was an increase of about 5% on 2017. This reflects the hard work and commitment shown by the trustees and supporters.

We evaluate grant applications twice a year (February and August), and as a result have made grants of £14,703 in 2018. Of this total, £6500 was to UK based organisations and the rest went to overseas organisations. It has been very encouraging to hear how the organisations have used the grants to further animal welfare and provide public benefit in doing do. We also spent just over £189 on the dogs of the homeless people in Bournemouth. This was our final involvement in this activity, as other organisations have taken over this valuable work.

The trustees have had due regard to the guidance on public benefit given in the Charities Act and the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 when planning and executing each event.

Plans for 2019.

We plan to consolidate our ongoing activities. We expect to work closely with the organisations that we support. We aim to keep the charity at about its current size as this works well for all involved with it. However, long term illness may start affecting our ability to continue to attend so many events each year in the future.
