Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2018

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

To provide vulnerable people, those with learning difficulties, mental ill health and dementia, the opportunity to engage in activities that will stimulate, educate and enable them to live a more fulfilled life, to know they are accepted and grow in confidence;

To promote and preserve well-being by the provision of day placements in an environment that will develop the service user's own skills and abilities to help maximise their potential;

To advance education about agriculture, horticulture, animal husbandry, the environment and the rural economy to appropriate levels of ability;

To encourage the participation of the local community in the service users' progression through volunteering and associated activities, enabling local people to contribute to the well-being of all;

To support the work through the creation of sustainable community enterprises.

Grant making

The charity does not make grants and has no investment programme other than in people.

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2018

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

2017 was special – 2018 has been specialer (quote from a farm worker) February: We artificially inseminated two of our sows: Flora, the British Lop Eared and Claire, one of our Oxford Sandy and Blacks. The next few months were interesting as we tended to the girls needs and kept them warm and well fed.

March: Like the rest of the East of England, we were hit hard by the 'Beast from the East'. The farm looked beautiful (see above) but the pipes froze and getting water to the animals was a slow process. We had to close for a day to ensure that none of our vulnerable people had a fall. We also erected our wonderful 'Creation Station' which is enjoyed most days by people doing arts'n'crafts and we prepared the ground for a new rose bed which becomes more spectacular each month.

April: Lots of planting (and weeding) took place. The sensory garden was being shaped and groomed and the Kingfishers were seen most days from the bird hide. Last year's signets had fled apart from one which couldn't fly. The big excitement of the month was having the RSPCA come and rescue him.

May: On the day that Harry and Megan were married we had a litter of piglets, six in all. Unfortunately, Flora, who had been getting bigger and bigger and who had been pampered and overfed for months, was not in fact pregnant and has been on a diet ever since.

June: Sadly, we had two deaths this month. Erica, one of our Golden Guernsey goats, contracted a bacterial infection and died within 24 hours. Whilst she was being treated, Geoffrey, the amazing Billy and the first animal we had at the farm, developed the same problem. Despite every effort they couldn't be saved... a very sad and difficult few days. The alpacas were shorn... always a very funny sight.

July: The market garden thrived and we started selling vegetables to Adnams for use in their pubs.

August: At one very memorable Saturday work party we laid the patio outside the future café.

October: We are blessed to have regular support from local organisations and this month a group from DWP helped us repaint the farm gates... multi-coloured! We also bought in Gorse, a beautiful young Billy to 'do the business' with our girls.

December: We hosted our first ever 'Craft Fair' which was a big success all around.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

The charity has received donations from The Edward and Ivy Rose Hood Memorial Fund, Tesco Bags of Help and many personal supporters. We are very grateful to every individual and every organisation that has supported us. We have been successful in applying for a number of funds during the year particularly: Suffolk Community Foundation, Orbit Housing and The Mrs L D Rope Third Charitable Settlement.

Reserves policy

On an ongoing basis the Trustees consider the level of reserves they wish to retain, appropriate to the Charity's needs and circumstances. This is based on the charity's size and level of commitments held. The Trustees endeavour not to set aside funds unnecessarily.

The Trustees aim to ensure the charity will be able to continue to fulfil its charitable objectives even if there is a temporary shortfall in income or unexpected expenditure. In doing this the Trustee's aim to make sure that the current budget forecast and reserves levels allow the charity to continue in operation for a rolling 12 month period. This is reviewed at a minimum at two points within the financial year.

FUTURE PLANS

Throughout the year we have continued the renewals programme in and around the courtyard. Each month sees further improvements which add to the aesthetic appearance and the functionality of the farm buildings. As well as continuing to work on the café, kitchen and toilet areas, over the next year we aim to start converting the old farmhouse into meeting rooms, complete the pottery and the barn conversion for Donkeys. The meeting rooms can then be hired out and help us generate additional income. The pottery will be a very positive addition to our offering for farm workers and will enable people to express themselves creatively as well as reap the therapeutic benefits of working with clay.

Everything we do is for the benefit of our farm workers. The donkeys (coming in early 2019) will fit so well with our therapeutic ethos. We are always looking to add strength and diversity to the board and employ staff as required.

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2018

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings, they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Improvements to property

- 20% on cost and 10% on cost

Farming equipment - mechanical

- 15% on cost

Farming equipment - other

- 10% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight-line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charity's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
